Chrysler Corp Show Increase

(Canadian Press) NEW YORK, N. Y., Oct. 24.—A substantial improvement in third quarter earnings this year over the like period of 1930 is reported by the Chrysler Corp. Consolidated net profit for the period this year was \$1,518,966, and equal to 34 cents a share, compared with a net loss of \$916,408 in the corresponding quarter of 1930. Net for the September quarter, however, fell behind the \$3,321,962 or 73 cents a share, reported for the second quarter of this year. In this connection however, it was pointed out that third quarter earnings of automobile manufacturers usually show a substantial decline from the preceding period.
