UNDER THE GOVERNMENT LICENSE LAW.

In order that all GUARDIAN readers may know precisely the terms and conditions on which the forty licensees of the Provincial Government are now engaged in selling liquors, we have obtained the following blank form from the Provincial Secretary's office. The form is official, but the names and descriptions of premises are fictitious, as the GUARDIAN is informed that none of the "certificates" have yet been issued to the liquor sellers. The following is the official form:

Liquor Seller's Certificate of Registration.

Provincial Secretary's Office,
Prince Edward Island.

This is to Certify that John Jones of Richmond Street, Wine Merchant in the City of Charlottetown, having this day registered a notice that he is desirous of selling Liquor in the said City, in compliance with the provisions of the Act 62 Vic. Cap 20, and having paid the registration fee or tax of One Hundred Dollars, is a duly REGISTERED LIQUOR SELLER under the provisions of the said Act, and is authorized to sell Liquors for a period of Six Months from the first Tuesday in June, A.D., 1899, and no longer, in the room or apartment situate on the ground floor of the north east corner of the building on south side of Richmond Street, bounded on the north by said street, on the east by a gangway then dwelling of A. B., on the south by yard and on the west by boarding house of A. B. C. in Charlottetown, aforesaid, as described and set forth in the said notice or application for registration, dated the first day of June A.D., 1899.

THIS CERTIFICATE IS NOT TRANSFERABLE.

This Certificate shall be hung or posted upon a conspicuous place on the wall of the room or apartment in which the Liquor is authorized to be sold.

Very little comment is necessary in regard to the above document. It is a license pure and simple issued by the government for and in consideration of the fee of \$100, by virtue of which the liquor seller is authorized to sell liquors for a period of six months. In the printed document supplied to THE GUARDIAN the concluding sentence is printed in red ink, possibly emblematic of the "blood-money" against which Premier Farquharson was wont to wax eloquent in time past. It is to be hung or posted in a conspicuous place on the wall of the room in which liquor is authorized to be sold. "Authorized" be the Farquharson government and for the consideration named therein!
