**Securities Display Firm Tone At Mt'l.**

MONTREAL, Nov. 4.—(CP)—Continuing the upward trends of the last few days, the stock market today opened on a firm tone in transfers and on the stock exchange and our market. All pivotal groups were pegged higher in the indices for the second day in a row. Volume was well above the recent average. Papers firming fractions to a point and getting lifts were Abitibi prior preferred, International, Fraser, Consolidated, Price, MacLaren, Donohue, H. Smith, B. C. Forest and Brown, Great Lakes was up for a time. Easter was St. Lawrence Paper preferred and Dorcas, which opened higher. Abitibi common and St. Lawrence common. Rises ran to 1-1/2 in Industrials. Higher were Electrolux, B. Products, Massey Ives, M. Locomotive, Cement, Cocksbutt, U. Steel, Fleet, Chrysler, Ford, Maxwell, Vickers stocks, C. Sugar, D. Engineer, Tar, R. Mitchell, Acadia "A" and D. Coal preferred. Softer were Slesco, N. S. Car, C. Locomotive, Cork, E. Steel, C. Car and B. Fairchild. Dooco was both up and down and evied even. Dominion Textile pushed up and Celanese was shaded in textiles. In beverages, winners were Seagrams, following a weak start. Walker, C. Breweries and Aloo "A" and "B". Commercial Alcohols dipped. Improved in utilities were Power Corporation, which was lower in initial transactions. Bell, Ottawa P&E, Quebec Power, Wintrop, Electric, B. C. Power "A" and "B" and Shawinigan. Braalran retrieved a slip. Montreal Power failed to hold an increase. C.E.P. was harder in carriers and Royal receded in banks. In metals, Aluminium jumped 1-1/2 and H.B. Mining was better and Smelters and Noranda inched back. Petroleum Imperial, McGill and E.A. posted gains in oil refiners. Hollinger, Balorne and Bulolo were up in golds and Homestead in western oils. Stronger among secondary metals were MacDonald, which was weaker at the commencement of trading. Slouven, Sherritt, Donalds, Joliet, Louvroult, Stadacona, E. Sullivan, Elder, Lingman, O'Brien, El Sol, Formaque and Pitt. Santiago converted a rise into a deficit and others in arrears were C. Cadillac, Akaitcho, Goldvue and Nechl.
