But Extensions are Now Necessary. The Finishing Mills Must be Completed so that the Whole Product will be Easily Marketable.

MONTREAL, July 24—Previous to leaving for Toronto this evening Mr. J. H. Plummer of the Dominion Iron and Steel Company said: "I believe firmly in the future of the Steel Plant, provided the finishing mills are completed which involves the provision of a considerable amount of new money. The best expert opinion I have been able to reach confirms the view that the conditions at Sydney are right, and the plant an excellent one so far as it goes, which is very near completion, but not quite up to the point."

"We have been making large billets for which there is no market in England and a very small one in Canada. Up to the present the American market has taken them at good prices, but the demand has fallen off. For a moderate expenditure we can place ourselves in position to carry the manufacture forward to a point at which our whole product will be marketable either at home or abroad."

"Pending the completion of the finishing mills and in view of the lessened demand from the United States we will not make so many billets, but this has to be borne in mind in the ultimate working of the property. I regard the question involved as chiefly one of finance. The possibility of the practical side have been pretty thoroughly tested."

In answer to an inquiry respecting the coal lease Mr. Plummer said: "I have the report in an evening paper about our coal supply in the event of the lease of the Dominion Coal property being for any reason abrogated. The lease itself contains a provision which in such an event will revive in effect the original contract between the two companies. This provides for the Steel Company's needs on the most satisfactory basis, so that under no circumstances could the property be hampered either by lack of or by an excessive charge for coal. The price fixed in the contract is about the cost of production and delivery."

RAPID PROGRESS OF A POPULAR CHARLOTTETOWN INSURANCE FIRM

Necessitating Additions and Improvements to the Offices of W. K. Rogers & Co., General Agents for the Canada Life and Other Assurance Companies.

There will be opened for business this week in the O'Holloran building on Great George St., next to the Bank of Nova Scotia, what are probably the finest insurance offices in the Maritime Provinces. These handsome and commodious quarters will be occupied by Messrs. W. K. Rogers & Co., who are general agents for this Province for The Canada Life Assurance Co., The British America Assurance Co. of Toronto, Ont., The Norwich Union Fire Insurance Co. of Norwich, England, The Law Union & Crown Insurance Co. of London, England, The Caerthian Insurance Co. of Edinburgh, The Home Fire Insurance Co. of New York, the Ocean Accident & Guarantee Corporation the largest casualty company in the world, of London, and the New York Plate Glass Co.

The Guardian (man yesterday had the privilege of visiting the new rooms and inspecting them. To say they are most creditable to the firm is not to say too much, they are a credit to the city and W. K. Rogers and Co. can point visitors to them with no small degree of satisfaction. Besides the old office formerly occupied by the firm the adjoining ones recently occupied by L. L. Beer have been leased. This has been necessitated by the great increase both in life and fire insurance business during the last three years.

The main office is 35x21 feet. The interior as well as the exterior has recently been in the hands of the carpenters and painters. The front has been torn out, and plate glass windows handsomely lettered in gold, now present an excellent appearance to the passer-by. The walls are finished in terra cotta and the furniture which is all new throughout is quartered oak, imported from Toronto.

In the front is a wall desk for the public. The counter extending nearly the entire width of the offices is of cherry and ash with oak top. Underneath is filled in with shelves and pigeon holes for the stationery of the different companies. In the rear of the counter is the large eight foot quartered oak standing desk, which is pronounced by experts to be the best in the province.

Passing by means of an arch out in the wall the visitor enters the new section. Here are the private offices of the manager, Mr. Rogers and of Mr. Brown. These together are the same length as the main office and are 12 feet wide. Mr. Rogers has new plate glass front, with the letters Canada Life Assurance Co. Established 1847. Assets over \$26,000,000 in gold, similar to the names of the other companies on the windows of the main office. This private office is furnished in green with hardwood floors and the furniture includes typewriter cabinet, new roll flat top desk, Masony sectional bookcase etc all in quartered oak.

In the rear is Mr. Brown's office. It is finished in terra cotta also, with hardwood floors and quartered oak furniture and has excellent light from the rear. The office throughout are heated with hot water and lighted by electric light.

business written prior to 1900 most by 1910 be on a 4% and by 1915 on a 3% basis. The Canada Life had for distribution at the time this act was passed, the largest surplus in its history, but instead of dividing it among its old policy holders and trusting to future profits to provide for the increase of the reserve, the Company at once made the change to a 3% basis using the large surplus on hand for this purpose. The Company took the ground that as it was the reserves on the old policies that had to be increased, it was only fair that the profits earned by these old policies should be used to increase it, and that they had no right to take the profits of the new policy holders to bring up the reserves of the old policies, as the new were paying such higher rates for the same kind of insurance.

We should have stated that the change of reserves on new business which went into effect January 1st, 1900 made it necessary for all companies to materially increase their rates on new business. This treatment of the surplus on hand at the close of 1899 raised quite a storm among the old policy holders, but the Company knowing they were right, stood by their action and through their agents explained the position to the policy holders, with the result that all fair minded men saw the justice of the action and the large increase of business from old policy holders has been the best reward the Company could have. New policy holders coming into the Canada Life knew that they will receive all the profits earned by their higher premiums, and that none of their money has to be taken to strengthen the reserves of policy holders whose premiums were very much lower for the same plans of insurance.
