Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—There is very little news this morning which would have any effect on the market. The big question at the present time is whether the market is going into new high ground for the year or whether it is going back away from the high for the third time. Volume indications were favorable yesterday. We would look for at least an irregular firm market today. Car loading report to be published on Friday should make very favorable reading and will probably show the largest car loadings for this year. This should help the rails to maintain their strength. The motor stocks acted better yesterday than they have for some time, both

General Motors and Chrysler look higher. Underneath of the oils is good and we would favor Secony Vacuum, Continental Oil and Standard Oil of New Jersey. Also think the steels have not seen their tops.

TORONTO, Sept. 22.—Falconbridge—Was permitted to resume mining operations on a reduced scale yesterday following the completion of a hook-up with the Abitibi Power System at Espanola by the Ontario Hydro Electric Power Commission. It is understood that about 20,000 H. P. of the necessary 40,000 is available. Full needs of the mine will not be filled for about a week or ten days. Power was cut off after the recent destruction of the Stinson Power Plant by fire.
