OTTAWA, July 8.—The Post Office Department calls attention to the fact that letters addressed to soldiers at the front should be signed by the writers in full. When letters signed by Christian name only cannot be delivered owing to the addresses being missing, wounded or dead, it is impossible for the Canadian Postal Service to return them to the senders. In view of this, the public is urged to fully sign all letters addressed to soldiers at the front, and in addition to this to indicate the name and address of the sender on the upper left-hand corner of the address side of the envelope. S. S. CONVENTION—The South West Queens District S. S. Convention, met in annual session at Cornwall Methodist Church, Tuesday June 29th ult. 1915. The afternoon session commenced at 2.45 p. m. Rev. G. Orman conducted the devotional exercises. The President, Mrs. David Scott; Secondary District Miss K. Marchison; Adult Division, John Heartz; Temperance Division, Harry Hyde; Missionary Division, Mrs. G. Orman; Educational Division, Rev. A. A. Gates; Home Department, Mrs. W. Lowther. The I. B. R. A., Mr. H. MacMillan. The report of the Resolution Committee was as follows: 1. Resolved that this convention place on record its deep sympathy with the Canadian mothers who have petitioned the Dominion Government—(which petition Sir Robert Borden has forwarded to the British Government to abolish the war camps in the training camps to which their brave boys go, and pray that their petition may be granted. While we deplore this great war and feel that it is a great testing time for our nation, we pray that God may ventiliate everything for our good and that His Kingdom may be more firmly established as a result (2) Resolved that the delegates of this convention place on record their appreciation of the hospitality extended to them by the people of Cornwall (3) Resolved that in the opinion of this convention, it be recommended to vary the form of the school work from time to time. The session then closed with the Doxology and Benediction by Rev. A. A. Gates. The evening session opened at 8 p. m. with devotions led by Rev. G. Orman.

FINDS PEACE SPIRIT IN MANY GERMANS.
LONDON, July 8.—Speaking at a Fourth of July celebration at the Browning Settlement in Walworth Road, Dr. Batten, a professor at Swarthmore College, who has spent several months in Europe since the war started, said, according to the Daily News, that in Germany among the theological and diplomatic classes and right down to the extreme left of the Social Democrats, he found that the peace movement had much more support than was admitted in the German press. The Chancellor, he said, desired peace, but it appeared that the military element was in the ascendancy.
