THE SHOOTING OF GEESE AND BRANT

Continued from page 1.

showed a gross ignorance of the bird which seemingly at all hazards they are determined to protect. On account of the want of knowledge thus displayed, I go to some trouble to enlighten the members of the society on the movements as well as the different species of Brant. There are three different species.

One kind flies up the Pacific Coast and hatches at the mouth of the Mackenzie River and of Herschell Island. Another kind flies across the land, and hatches in the marshes north of Manitoba, whilst the species with which we are familiar, although some of them remain with the geese of the coast of Digby for the winter, comes from the south and hatches on the West Coast of Greenland.

It can be seen by the resolution of said meeting that the open season would begin on May 15th. From a close diary of the flights of the bird a copy of which is here given it will be seen that a very short time would thus be given the sportsmen in Richmond Bay and vicinity.

I am aware that Brant remain in some parts of the Island to a later date than any above enumerated. The reason is plain, as they fatten more quickly in Richmond Bay than in other parts of the Island. The cause of this is the great amount of herring spawn which adheres to the seaweed upon which spawn the brant.

My opinion, backed by the opinions of many sportsmen in the western part of the Island, is that both geese and brant are just as plentiful now as they were thirty years ago. With a true sportsman a certain amount of hardship is necessary for a true pleasure and recreation but it seems to be the aim of those who advocate a change in the existing law, (many of whom could not recognize a crow from a goose at an hundred yards), to have climatic conditions so, that the killing of birds for recreation with the natural difficulties of early spring shooting.

Also with justice to a great many farmers who are true sportsmen and can spare only a few days from their ordinary pursuits at the early part of the season for recreation before the difficult work of sowing their crops, I would recommend that the law as it is now on the Statutes be retained without amendment. Hoping that, after a calm consideration of the many points in favor of the intention of the law as it now stands, the Society will see fit to refuse to urge the Government to the proposed changes. SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

FEBRUARY 2
JESUS THE SAVIOUR OF THE WORLD.
John 3: 1-21. Memorize verses 14-16
GOLDEN TEXT.

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.—John 3: 16.

EXPLANATION.

1. Look and live, 11, 15. Nicodemus was the teacher of Israel (v. 10, R. V.) and yet he did not know the fundamental truth taught in the Old Testament as well as in the New, namely, the doctrine of the new birth. But do all the teachers in the church know it even now? There was no speculation or guess work at all in Jesus' own teaching. He could say, "We speak that we do know and bear witness of what we have seen" (v. 12 R. V.) Nicodemus had asked Jesus, "How can these things be?" (v. 9). In the 14th and 15th verses Jesus answers Nicodemus' question how. He pointed to him how Moses lifted up the brazen serpent made in the likeness of the fiery serpent that had bitten the people, on the pole (Num. 21: 6-9). Just so, God has lifted Jesus, made sin for us, on the cross (Rom. 8: 3; 2 Cor. 5: 21; Gal. 3: 13; John 12: 31, 32) All the Israelites believed on the fiery serpent had to do to find life, was simply to believe in the power of the serpent on the pole to heal and to show his faith by just looking. So all we have to do is simply to believe in the power of Jesus, made in the likeness of sinful flesh, and lifted on the cross, to heal and to show our faith.

Why was came, 16: 21. Verse 16 has probably been used to the salvation of more persons than any other verse in the Bible. It contains the Gospel in a nutshell. (1) The need of salvation—"shall not perish." (2) The origin of salvation—God's love. (3) The ground of salvation—the death of Christ (God gave His only begotten Son). (4) The condition of salvation—"believe on Him." (5) The recipients of salvation—"Whosoever believeth." (6) The results of salvation (a) Shall not perish. (b) Shall have eternal life. The verses also contain a marvelous revelation of God's love. (1) The objects of God's love—"the world." (2) The character of God's love. (3) God's holding nothing back. (4) Self-sacrificing—giving His very best. (5) Holy—forgiving sin without an adequate expression of His hatred of it. (6) The manifestation of God's love in the gift of His only begotten Son. (7) The purpose of God's love—to save. (8) The result of God's love—whosoever believes gets everlasting life. Verses 14 and 16 were spoken by Jesus Himself. He came to save but brings the greater condemnation (cf. Heb. 10: 28, 29). The one who rejects Jesus is condemned ALREADY. It is not so much that the wrath of God is coming upon those who reject Jesus Christ at some future time, the wrath of God, the intense displeasure of God, already hangs over everyone who rejects Jesus. If we continue to reject the wrath of God will abide on us (v. 36). The moment we accept Jesus we step out from underneath the dark thunder-cloud of God's wrath into the bright sunlight of God's favor. God aimed to save the world. He made provision for the salvation of the world, but only those who accept the salvation are actually saved. Jesus is in a sense the Saviour of all men (1 Tim. 4: 10). By His death He made preparation for the whole world (1 John 2: 2, R. V.). He provided the ground upon which God could deal in mercy with every member of the human race, but He is especially the Saviour of those who believe. They alone appropriate to themselves and therefore enjoy in full the salvation which Jesus purchased by his blood (Rom. 3: 25, 26). The condemnation that comes on the one who does not believe is just the inevitable. He has chosen darkness rather than light. The only begotten Son came, the incarnation of all the perfect attributes of God, and he would not leave Him. What a man does with Jesus shows what the man is at heart. What a man chooses always shows what a man is.
