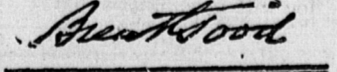
GREAT BRITAIN LIKELY TO RELEASE SEIZED VESSEL.

WASHINGTON, October 31.—After a conference between Acting Secretary Lansing, of the state department, and Sir Cecil Spring-Rice, the British ambassador, it was stated authoritatively that Great Britain probably would release the vessels carrying American copper detained at Gibraltar.

It was learned that the Italian government already has declared an embargo on the exportation of copper to belligerent countries, but that the notification had not formally reached England. As soon as the fact is communicated thru official channels the steamers destined to Italy will be permitted to continue their voyage, according to the view of British officials here.
