CRUELTY TO ANIMALS.

We hear intimations of a movement to revive the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in this City and Province. There is great need of such a society here. Every kindly and humane person must be shocked by the sights sometimes witnessed in loading cattle on train or boats, or on seeing some poor horse hauling a load beyond his strength and unmercifully whipped or beaten.

The mass of our people are as kindly as any in the world, and it is the comparatively few who are so thoughtless or cruel as to impose needless suffering upon poor dumb creatures, whether domestic animals or wild birds and beasts. But these few ought to be restrained. The law is strong and clear enough, but there is no one whose business it is to apply it. The Society would supply this want.

We believe public sentiment will favor the movement and that with a little effort a good working society can be formed that may be fruitful of much good. We have frequently referred to this matter, in past years but regrettably the matter was not taken up. It is well to begin now and with all convenient speed.

THE OLD BURYING GROUND.

The movement inaugurated some three years ago to clean up and beautify the Old Burying Ground on the Malpeque road has resulted in making this historic place look fairly creditable. The tremendous growth of shrubbery has been cleared out, walks have been made, flowers have been planted, fallen tombstones have been set up, the vaults have been repaired, and the general appearance of the place savors of Christian attention. How nice.

The resting place of our dead will no longer be a reproach to our fair city. The committee, of which Mr. Alexander Horne is the energetic chairman, intend pushing the good work forward, and to this end have secured the services of Mr. Fred LePage in soliciting subscriptions to defray the expenses. The Guardian sincerely hopes that the response will be most liberal, for nothing is more commendable in the eyes of strangers than a well kept cemetery.

The order has been sent to Council by the Secretary of State revoking the Canada Temperance Act in King's County. On the 8th of July it will be revoked in Queens.

WASHINGTON, D. C., June 20.—Rear Admiral Brownson, who commands four armored cruisers now attached to the Atlantic fleet, is to be sent with his division to Eastern waters. These ships will sail in September, and on their way to the Orient will visit England as a return call for that of the squadron of Prince Louis of Battenburg last year. Unless unforeseen circumstances occur, the coming autumn will witness the assembling of the greatest fleet that ever has gathered in the waters of the western world—a force comprising sixteen battleships of first-class, two divisions of torpedo craft, one of destroyers, another of torpedo boats, there will also be fleet auxiliaries. The Armada, which is to be placed under command of Rear Admiral Evans, the present commander of the Atlantic fleet will equal in strength Great Britain's renowned Mediterranean fleet, which is now the most formidable aggregation of warships in all the seven seas; sixteen battleships, commanded by the redoubtable sea warrior, Admiral Lord Charles Boscawen. Six new battleships, some of which are already commissioned and others receiving final touches, before being turned over to the Navy Department, will swell the September total of sixteen battleships of recent construction and high degree.
