Tomatoes on the Fence vie With Marigolds in Beauty. Tomatoes are the Victory garden's most important crop. Even the smallest garden can grow them and get a good yield for the space. A well-grown plant should yield a peck of fruit or more, properly cared for, fed and watered. When space is limited, plants can be staked or trained to a fence, or trellis, and take up no more room than a row of carrots. Each plant yields a little less, but the fruit will average better, and mature earlier; and more plants can be grown in less space. Heaviest yields are obtained from plants that sprout on the ground, but they take lots more room. Plants are usually grown under protection, or purchased, and set out after all danger of frost is over. They mature fruit earlier than is possible by sowing seed in the garden; but not as much earlier as might be supposed. Many tests have shown that plants directly sown, straw, lawn clippings, or any suitable material keeps the soil from drying out and increases yield. Tomatoes will be killed by a frost, and may be injured by a severe chill, so they should not be exposed to such experience.

HOLLYWOOD HAS 'OPEN HOUSE' FOR SERVICE VISITORS

VICTORIA, June 26 -- (CP) -- Mrs. Ruth Day of Hollywood, California, a visitor here, calls herself "a career woman at 50." Her job women have a good time during their visits to the movie capital. Rev. E. Carnegie Heard In Fine Address At Bible Society

Following is the text of an address delivered on Monday evening, June 26th, by the Reverend Charles Carnegie, Pastor of the Presbyterian Church, Summerside, at the 10th annual meeting of the Prince Edward Island Auxiliary of the British and Foreign Bible Society. Text: Psalm CXIX: 105--"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." Rev. Carnegie announced this oft-quoted declaration of the psalmist as my text, I have not come to you with any proposition to enter upon an exposition or examination of this declaration of Scripture. Rather my purpose is to use it as the basis for the introduction of our theme, "God's Word--A Lamp unto OUR feet and a light unto OUR path. Is it?" At the outset let me say that I esteem it a very high honour indeed to have been invited to give an address at the Annual Meeting of the Prince Edward Island Auxiliary of the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada and Newfoundland. My only regret is that the tremendous pressure of my duties since I returned from General Conference in Toronto has made it utterly impossible for me to prepare as I should have liked. I have a personal conviction that no theme can, or should, challenge any Christian minister more than that of the work of the Bible Society. For the great work of the Christian Mission, (and let me say here in parenthesis--I for one am glad that it is so) Christians are reaching a point when we realize how utterly arbitrary is our position. We are being drawn into "home" and "foreign." These two are one, and what God has joined together let no man put asunder. In the great work of the Christian mission the Bible Society and the Christian Church are one. The Christian Church turns to the Bible Society with such words as Mr. Churchill used in an hour of crisis in his famous speech: "I will finish the job." And the Church has never turned to the Bible Society in vain. As His Excellency, the Governor General, has so well put it in his message to the Executive of the Society, "The Bible Society has been a splendidly performed, of the British and Foreign Bible Society to spread the knowledge of the Bible among all peoples so they may become the text book of statesmen, the literary model of men of letters, the mainstay of the guide book of philosophers, and the everyday companion of countless thousands who seek comfort and refreshment in its hallowed pages. Even amidst the severe war restrictions the work which the British and Foreign Bible Society has accomplished--if only in the distribution of the Word to those in the services--has been simply amazing. Vital Work For these reasons, if for none other, I have been, and shall always be, a loyal supporter of the British and Foreign Bible Society. These, then, are no empty words when I say that I esteem it a high honour indeed to have been invited to speak to you here tonight. The work of the British and Foreign Bible Society is more than inter-denominational. The Society in its work knows no denominations as such. I am, therefore, very glad that, at least so far as Summerside is concerned, we have made a most successful start in the work of the Society. The result is that, instead of only the known interest in each few in each congregation being canvassed, a most thorough canvass has been made of the work of the British and Foreign Bible Society, and has taken charge of the work with an appreciation that here is a really worthwhile contribution to the forward march of Christianity. All have worked with enthusiasm and heartiness. This is no oversight for this work was undertaken with no desire that any one team should have the honour. On the contrary, (and I believe this is healthy Christianity), the desire was that the right hand know what the right hand did. Our aim was to meet our objective, and we did. I mention these things not to publicize Summerside, but to throw out the challenge to this Annual Meeting that a campaign of the B. and F. Bible Society of our province should set ourselves with as much preparation, thoroughness and fervour as any of the great war-time campaigns in the conduct of which we have become so very expert. Here is a campaign that must go on, year after year, until every last human soul knows, and has in his hands to read, the Word of God. "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." The Bible and Its Place But now, as we think of the work of the British and Foreign Bible Society, we inevitably and naturally think of the Bible--of the Bible and its place not in foreign, heathen lands but in our own so-called Christian Canada. Is it, as the psalmist proclaims in our text, is it a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path? I am sure you will remember the incident in the life of the good Queen Victoria, to which I have made reference on a former occasion, when replying to the inquiry of a distinguished guest, Her Majesty picked up a Bible and said, "There is the secret of my people's greatness." It was a simple answer. Yet my brethren, there is the secret, which we are so much in danger of forgetting in these days. Men and nations are searching in vain for the secret of greatness in such strange and impossible places. Oh, how good to get back to the Book, and through it back to God! No matter how loyal we are to

our own church denomination -- and I do yield to none in loyalty to the faith of my fathers -- we cannot but deplore the domination of British liberty which Christianity has been torn asunder. None surely will deny that, if ever that day is to dawn when our Lord's own prayer is to be realized, and we all shall be one even as the Father and He (John XVIII:1), it will be around these unchanging verities -- ONE GOD and ONE CHRIST, and these have been fully revealed unto us in ONE Book--the Bible. When will it come home to us with conviction that in the final analysis the bond which unites all the peoples of the earth as one is the Bible? Amidst the crowding and rush of these busy, straining days, how seldom we pause to think of the great debt which civilization owes to the Bible--that open Bible, "Truly God's Word has been a lamp unto the feet and a light upon the path of marching civilization." But deny that? No, very long ago an eminent English divine (Dr. Mathews, the Dean of St. Paul's) said, "The spirit of a nation is difficult to describe, and many strains have gone into its composition. (In the development of that which we call British civilization) the English Bible has been the predominant influence." If we pause for a moment to reflect, we concede at once the accuracy of this statement. All of our moral standards, all of our social structure, and all of our national development, which are in the very pattern and fabric of our hours, liberty and civilization had their inspiration in the Book, which today in large measure we are content to leave unopened and unread, the world's best seller, but a book that is unread and by many unloved! Lord Tweedsmuir's Words Speaking in the City of Toronto the late Lord Tweedsmuir made one of his most sincere statements. These were his words, "The Bible is our national constitution. In it will be found the key to whatever is great in our history, and the chief bond between the English-speaking peoples, for it is our long tradition, and it constitutes our hope of the future. He closed a memorable address with these words, "I am convinced to think that if the Bible were the habitual text-book of statesmen today... there would be more wisdom and charity in the world." Yes, if ever the world and the men and nations in the world were in a lamp unto their feet and a light upon their path, it is in these crucial days of transition from war to peace. That lamp and that light are here -- the open Book--the Word of God. But if all that I have thus far said is true of the world, and our national life, what shall I say in closing of those things which belong to the life and the soul of the individual? What shall I say of the Bible and its relation to our own spiritual welfare? "Where there is no vision," says the old Scriptural proverb, "the people perish." That is just another way of saying that without faith we, individually and collectively, are dead. What is faith? The more one reads the more one is convinced of the truth of this basic word, "faith," that are heaped upon us. Personally I can think of no better or more comprehensive definition of faith than that recorded in the Book so long ago: "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews XI:1). "Faith means we are confident of what we do not see, convinced of what we do not feel." Faith is, then, in the final analysis not a quest; we are tired of seeking everywhere for a revelation, a stabilizing faith. Faith is not a quest; it is a revelation, and that revelation is here in this Book, the Bible. Let us, then, my brethren, cease from our restless rushing to and fro, our ceaseless and needless searching, and let us listen in quietness of mind to the seeking of salvation and the revelation of that which is the very keystone of our faith.
