ANOTHER SUGGESTION FOR SOLDIERS' MEMORIAL

A Provincial Highway Connecting Principal Centres of Province and Suitably Marked at Intervals.

When Mr. Robert L. Cotton was at home on furlough last winter he made some suggestions to the Premier and several others in respect to the construction of our Provincial war memorial. After his return for discharge a few days ago he was asked to put these suggestions into shape for further and more general consideration. In reply to that request he has submitted the following:

THE TASKS OF PEACE.

FIRST.—The construction of a memorial which will hand down to the generations to come the record of those of Prince Edward Island who have fought and especially those who have died in the great cause in these great days just past.

SECOND.—The provision of immediate employment for those returning men who seek it.

THIRD.—Bettering the facilities for home-making for those who wish to settle down. Together with the creation of a greater density of rural population which will make possible the provision of better rural schools, a fuller social life, and more modern services generally.

In respect to the First Task of Peace.—

France and Belgium are providing for a great Battlefields Highway, extending along the whole line of conflict from Alsace to the Belgian shore adjoining which the scenes of glory and the graves of the dead will be cared for as national trusts for all time. This will be the greatest of all outward memorials of the war.

Prince Edward Island's memorial to her glorious—sons in the war—following this great example, might well take the form of a Great War Highway to be known perhaps as the 'Great War Road,' of best modern construction of either concrete or tar, linking up first the centres of Charlottetown, Summerside and Borden, and eventually extending from end to end of the province.

The mile stones along the way might be individual monuments to those whose bones rest in France or Flanders' fields; some villages might take the names of those places where the most famous engagements were fought; hardwood trees such as line the great French roads might be planted at convenient spaces for every Islander who took an active part; finger posts at the cross roads would point the way and tell the distance to every settlement; and if we are ready to do things on a big scale, and I think we are, we might have also in each county, at the principal centre on the highway erect a Memorial Hall built of Island stone, of suitable size for lectures and educational purposes, with glass cases containing souvenirs from the battlefields; and on the walls printed records setting forth to succeeding generations the war record of Canada and more minutely the war record of Prince Edward Island and her five thousand fighting sons.

Adopt this suggestion for the First Task of Peace and you are well on the way to the solution of the second—Immediate Employment for Returning Men.

Who are better fitted to put their labor on the memorial to the dead than those who have seen them bleed and die?

Work could begin very early in the spring, sooner than would be possible to have organization and plans complete.

And the solution of this second task of peace will be further helped, in the solution of the third, which in turn will be greatly simplified if the suggestion for the first should be adopted.

Facilities for Home Making. And Greater Density of Population.

For the soldier who has the desire and the ability to go into farming for himself on a broad scale the loan arrangements of the Federal Government, together with his own gratuity, provide pretty much all the financial assistance that is necessary; and the other essentials are at hand.

In these days a well cultivated farm of a hundred acres, properly stocked and with the right buildings and machines means a capital investment of pretty nearly if not quite ten thousand dollars—and in some cases much more than that sum.

It is not every one that has the qualification, on the farm any more than in the city, of earning interest and depreciation on such an investment, together with adequate payment for his own labor.

Those not fitted to make a real success on such a scale will have to consider something smaller. A fifty acre farm involving perhaps a five thousand investment is easier to swing and some may well find even that in Prince Edward Island more satisfying and more sure than a quarter, half or whole section of unbroken prairie land.

But the thing that alone promises to give Prince Edward
