U.S. - Soviets In Trade Agreement For One Year

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—(AP)—The United States and Soviet Russia today extended their trade agreement for another year, with the Moscow Government reserving the right to suspend purchases at any time American defence restrictions make exporting too difficult.

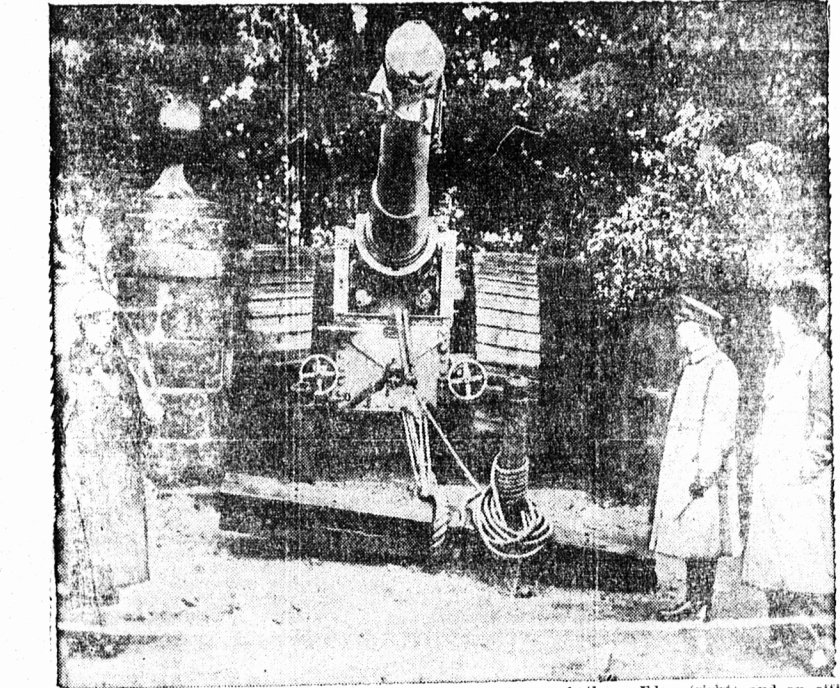
The Soviet already has raised objections to the restrictions imposed on the export of machine tools and other equipment declared to be needed in the United States defence program.

OTTAWA, Aug. 6.—(CP)—A weight was lifted from the hearts of Canadians today when Prime Minister Mackenzie King announced to the House of Commons that Canada's Great War memorial at Vimy Ridge is apparently undamaged after the battles in France.

Air Training Period To Be Shortened

OTTAWA, Aug. 6.—(CP)—Shortening of the elementary, intermediate and advanced training periods under the British Commonwealth Air Training plan from eight to seven weeks each was announced tonight by Air Minister Power. He said the move, made at the request of the United Kingdom, was designed to accelerate the output of pilots.
