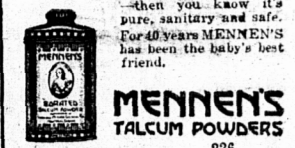

THE NAVY LEAGUE PROPERTY.—Extensive repairs and alterations are to be made to the Ings property at the Esplanade recently purchased by the Navy League of Canada. The breastwork facing the waterfront is now being newly rebuilt the work being done under the direction of Mr. Charles McGregor. Just twenty-five years ago Mr. A. E. Ings, now Colonel Ings, engaged Mr. McGregor to construct this breastwork and now after all these years it falls to Mr. McGregor's lot to renew the work of that time which has stood the ravages of the years wonderfully all things considered. After this work is completed it is expected that this part of the property may be used for training purposes etc., in connection with the sailors institute to be established. The residence on the Ings property where this institute is to be located is now in the process of receiving alterations for the new order of things. Its outer appearance has already been improved by the removal of the old verandah, the painting up of the brickwork and other repairs. Considerable changes will also be made in the interior of the building.

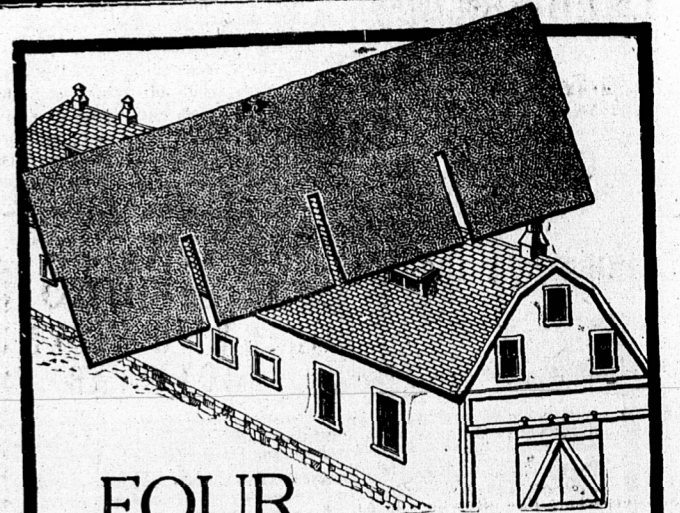
Canada Orders Australian Wine
