The Guardian is authorized by G. A. Sharp, Superintendent, Prince Edward Island Railway to state that, owing to the soft condition of the track, which compels a slower rate of speed of trains, from April 30th until May 5th, 1906, both dates inclusive, the morning express train from Souris and Georgetown will not connect at Royal Junction with the morning express train from Charlottetown.

THURSDAY afternoon the formal meeting to nominate a successor to the late Archbishop, Halifax was to take place. This meeting is attended by four bishops of the ecclesiastical province of Halifax, Bishop Cameron, Antigonish; Bishop McDonald, P. E. Island; Bishop Barry, Chatham, and Bishop Casey, St. John. Every detail of this meeting will be absolutely private, and nothing will be known as to any selection made. The custom is to nominate three persons, the names of whom are forwarded to Rome, where the appointment is made, and it is not known at what period the matter will be settled.

The Dominion and Provincial Departments of Agriculture are alive to the dangers which ensue from the introduction of noxious weeds introduced in various ways, both by the importation of seeds for the farm, and by the feeding of screenings. This danger threatens a serious loss in crop production, and the Governments are arranging to co-operate again this year for the purpose of holding field meetings during the months of June, when weeds, insects, fungus diseases and plant growth are most in evidence. The services of Prof. Loebhead of the McDonald Agricultural College at St. Anne de Bellevue have been secured to conduct similar farmers' nature study meetings in the three Maritime Provinces. Here is provided an opportunity for farmers to get at first hand, information that cannot be given or demonstrated in hall meetings during the winter.
