Permits Needed For Export Of Salt Fish

OTTAWA, June 23 (CP)—Fisheries Minister Bertrand said tonight that under a United Nations plan for world rationing of salt fish, Canada will require its entire exportable surplus of dried, boneless, and green-salted fish to the United States, the British West Indies, Porto Rico, and Latin America, on a quota basis.

Continue Raids on Sicily, Sardinia

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA, June 24 (AP)—Bomber squadrons from the twin allied air commands in the Mediterranean—R.A.F. heavyweights from Middle East bases and Wellingtons flying under the northwest African command—have again spread fire and steel over Sicilian and Sardinian targets, it was announced today.

Lumber Mill, Five Potato Sheds Burned

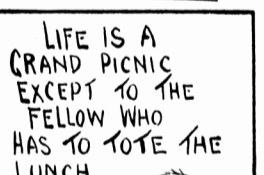
