STR. AMERICAN SAILS FOR BERMUDA

Bound to Bermuda with a cargo of 900 tons of coal the steamer American sailed from Halifax at noon yesterday. The steamer was delayed several days, and finally got away yesterday. The American which registers 971 tons gross and 588 net tons, is now owned by New York parties.

EMPRESS OF FRANCE DUE AT HALIFAX THIS EVENING

The R. M. S. Empress of France, at 11 o'clock last night was 350 miles from Halifax and was reported by wireless to be coming ahead slowly, on account of a heavy vapor that was covering the water. If weather conditions are favorable, she will dock this evening about 8 o'clock.

GLACE BAY, Jan. 14.—The Dominion Coal Company will shortly open a new 600 foot shaft at Quarry Point, about a mile and a quarter from No. 4 Caledonia Colliery, which will result in the closing down of the latter. The new mine will be sunk on the Phalen Steam opening the submarine levels and touching the working of both No. 2 and 4 as they exist at present. It will not alter the present output of No. 2 which is about 2200 tons daily, but is expected to double the output of No. 4 which is superseded. This will make its daily average from 1500 to 2,200 tons.
