APPOINTMENT OF ENVOY APPROVED NEW YORK, June 14.—The Tribune in an editorial dealing with the possible discussion of the appointment of a Canadian ambassador to Washington during the coming imperial conference, this morning says:

Such a step toward cementing the relations between the United States and the Dominions would naturally be welcomed in this country. But, despite the fact that the British government, when change was announced, said it did not denote any departure from the principle of the equality of the British empire, complications have arisen which have prevented sending the new functionary to his post.

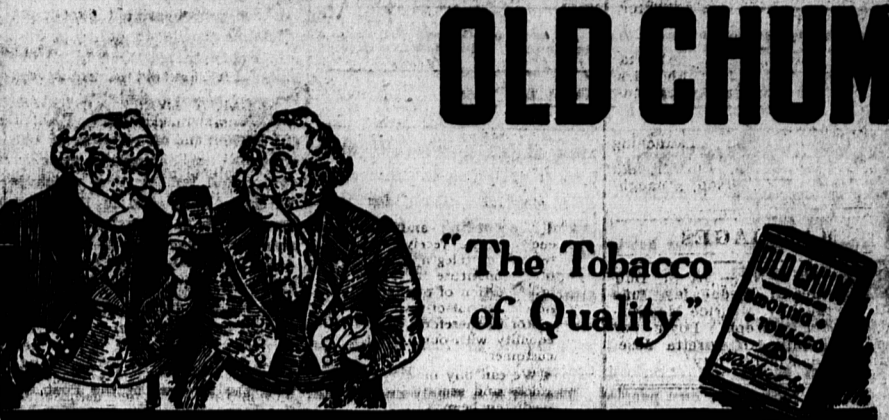
