rel tallow, 14 boxes, 4 barrels and 2 bags
produce.

lost on Lake Huron. The Antelope was com-
manded by Peter McMahon, Charlottetown.
There were three other Charlottetown
men on board, Daniel Sullivan, the well

McGee and John Dunn. The Antelope
left the city about a month ago for To-
ronto, taking up plank, &c, that had been
used in connection with the Hillsbor-
ough Bridge. Since reaching Ontario
she has been carrying lumber for Mr.
Haney, between Toronto and Parry
Sound.
