THE HALIFAX REVIEW.

The 4th Regiment of Artillery with the Engineers and the Army Medical Corps, in all some 350 officers and men, have been ordered to Halifax to join in the parade attendant upon the visit of the Duke of Cornwall to that city and his departure from Canada.

It is true that military drill, the competition at Quebec and the tournament at Halifax have already taken the men away from their ordinary callings during the past season, and this new call may be felt by employers as somewhat of a tax upon their patience.

Mr. Douglas Storey, an American correspondent who is making the trip through Canada with the Royal party, writes as follows from Ottawa to the Boston Herald:

A VALUABLE COAL LAYER.
