The western train arrived in this city at nine-fifty last evening—its regular time. The morning train from the west was also on time. The Murray Harbor train was an hour and forty minutes late, the morning train from the east was thirty-five minutes late and the evening train from the east ten minutes late.

Owing to the lack of accommodation for freight at Cape Tormentine, the heavy sea and ice conditions, the Minto did not call at that port yesterday on her way from Summerside. She had on board a full cargo of freight from Summerside, consisting of the greater part of pork and poultry and had no space remaining for freight outward from this port. She had four passengers en route from Summerside to Pictou.

The change in the P. E. I. R. timetable for the winter season 1910-1911, goes into effect on Dec. 27th. On the whole the timetable then will be the same as last year's winter timetable with the exception of the Souris and Murray Harbor trains leaving this city in the afternoon. Last year these left at 3.15 and 3. respectively while this year they will leave at 3.20 and 3.10 as they are at present. After 27th the trains outward from this city will be: West: Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 12 and 2.55 p. m., Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 2 p. m. and daily at 7.15 a. m. The trains from the west will arrive Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 10.10 a. m. and 1.45 p. m. on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, at 11.30 a. m. and daily at 5.15 p. m. The trains east leave here daily at 3.20 p. m. and arrive here on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays at 10 a. m. and Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 10.55. The train South will leave daily at 3.10 and arrive here Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 9.25 a. m. and Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 10.15.
