FOR ARMY REFORM

Permanent War Office Board Called For

UNDER SEC. OF STATE

The Army not to be Ruled by Minutes of Council Any Longer.

TO REFORM THE WAR OFFICE.

LONDON, June 6.—(Special.)—A special committee recommends the abolition of the present system of ruling the army by Minutes of Council and irritating regulations both military and financial and urges a simplification and decentralization, that the War Office should be relieved of the mass of routine work now absorbing an enormous staff of officials.

WAR OFFICE BOARD REVISED.

The Committee further report that officers commanding districts should have enlarged powers and finally that a permanent War Office Board should be established under the authority of the Secretary of State to control the business of the War Office as a whole, without detracting from the individual responsibility of the Commander in Chief and heads of departments.

THE DOORWAY OF A CONTINENT.

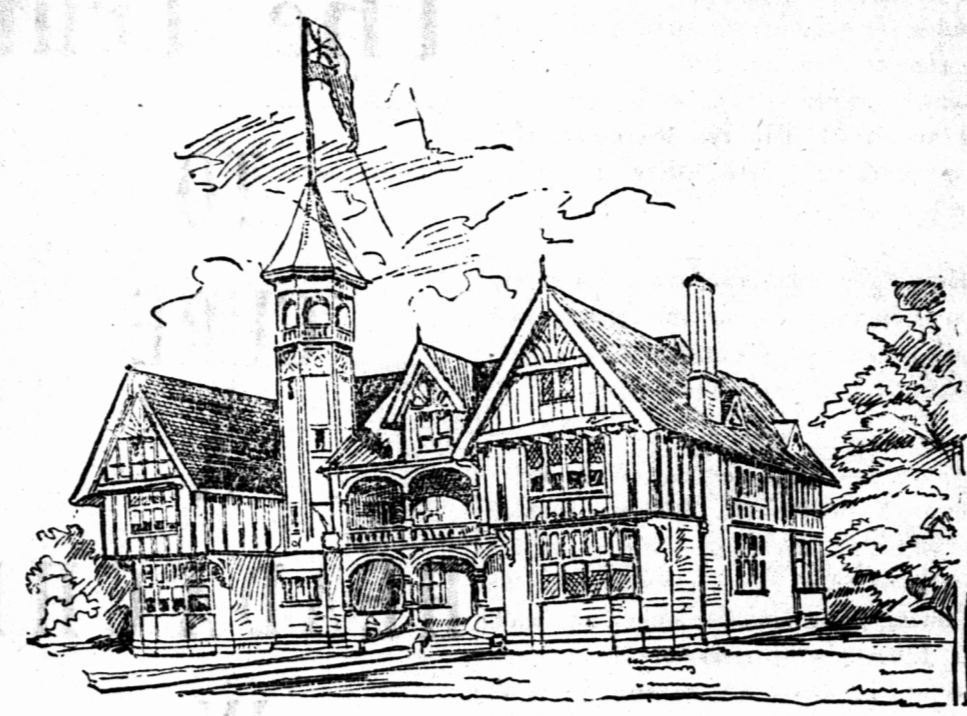

THE BOERS WHIPPED

Losing Prisoners Cattle and Supplies

BRITISH LOSS THREE

Dastardly Attempt to Burn an R. C. College With Kerosene.

THE BOERS BADLY WHIPPED. PRETORIA, June 6.—(Special.)—Col. Wilson with 240 of Kitchener's Scouts surprised and routed 400 Boers west of Warmbath.

The Boers left 35 dead, one hundred prisoners, all their waggons and supplies including 800 cattle.

ATTEMPTED RESCUE FAILED.

The British loss was three killed, fifteen wounded. The Boers main Commando arrived soon after but failed in their effort to recapture their supplies.

ATTEMPT TO BURN A COLLEGE.

NEW YORK, June 6.—(Special.)—A discharged employee to-day attempted to burn St. John's College and Seminary, Brooklyn in which were eighteen priests and 40 seminarians. Kerosene was scattered about and ignited.
