STRIKING ALBERTA NN NN N MINERS STILL IN AN UGLY MOOD

CALGARY, Alta., Sept. 1.—Information received here late this afternoon from Drumheller, where trouble developed Thursday between striking coal miners and provincial police, indicated that while the situation had improved the miners were still in an ugly mood.

The Midland, Western, Gem and Hygrade mines are closed and are being closely picketed. Robert Livett, international representative of the United Mine Workers of America, stated today that the men had acted without consulting the union officials and was not prepared to make any definite statement as to whether the management of the Western Gem mine had broken the agreement by employing new men in preference to older employees.

M. G. TEED HEADS LAW COMMISSION

MONTREAL, Sept. 2.—At today's session of the conference of commissioners on uniformity of legislation in Canada meeting here prior to the convention of the Canadian Bar Association next week, His Honor Sir James Aikins, K.C., Lieutenant-Governor of Manitoba, announced that owing to increasing pressure of his other public duties, he could not accept re-election as president of the conference. He was prevailed on to accept the position of honorary president. M. G. Teed, K. C., of St. John N. B., was elected to succeed Sir James as president, with Isaac Pitblado, K. C., Winnipeg, as vice-president; John D. Faxonbridge, K. C., Toronto, and John C. Elliott, K. C., London, Ont., continue as secretaries of the conference.

VANCOUVER'S NEW GRAIN ELEVATOR

VANCOUVER, B.C., Sept. 2.—A building permit for the new two million bushel grain elevator to be erected adjacent to the new government dock here by the Board of Harbor Commissioners, has been granted by the city. The structure will cost \$1,200,000.

The completion of the foundation upon which work is expected to be done in about four weeks, the object being to complete the elevator so that it will be ready to handle part of the 1923 crops. It is estimated that it will take at least four months to complete the structure.

Valuable bronzes Were Found

LONDON, Sept. 1.—A prehistoric burial place, dating back to the early iron age has been found four feet under the surface at Burnmouth, Berwickshire. It contained a skeleton in a crouching position. In the skull was a set of thirty-two teeth in excellent preservation, and on the ear floor, which was flanked and covered with rude stone clubs, some valuable bronzes and an iron knife were found. The bronzes are the first of the kind ever found in Scotland though thirteen have been found in England. Close to the head of the skeleton the skulls of two young pigs were found. The relics have been preserved by J. H. Crow, a well-known Border naturalist.
