Steeles enjoyed a temporary run-up when current mill operations were estimated at 32.7 per cent of capacity an increase of 2.5 points from the preceding week. Most stocks in this group emerged with slight declines.

Selected copers revived when the export price of the metal was cut to just under the 10 cent level, renewing hopes consumers will come into this market to fill postponed demands if the domestic rate is further reduced.

Butter prices eased slightly on Montreal open produce markets today but other lines ruled steady.

Butter was quoted at 32-32 1/2 cents a pound for carlots or less of No. 1 with lots to retailers at 32 1/2 for solids and 33 for prints.

Graded egg shipments in carlots or less were 25 cents a dozen for A-large, 23 for A-medium, 21 for A-pullets, and 20-21 for B-large and B-medium storage.

Cheese was 14 1/2-15 1/2 for western current receipts and 15 1/2-16 1/2 for western summer make.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Jan. 24 (CP)—Today's livestock receipts totaled 1,228 cattle, 671 calves, 311 sheep and lambs, 1,614.

Cattle sales were fairly active at about steady prices for steers and a slightly lower trend on cows.

Steers ranged from \$4 to \$6.50, good steers selling from \$5.75, and common steers around \$4 to \$4.50.

Butcher heifers ranged from \$3.50 to \$5.50. Good cows were mostly from \$2.50 to \$4 with the bulk between \$3.25 and \$3.75.

Medium cows made from \$3.25 to \$4 and common butchers from \$3 to \$3.25 with earners and cullers from \$2.25 to \$3.75, the bulk selling around \$2.50.

Veal calves were steady to strong with grass calves were a shade easier. There were no top veals.

Medium good veals sold up to \$9.50. The bulk of the veals were plain to just medium quality and were sold in mixed lots at \$8.50 to \$9. Common light veals sold down to \$6.50.

Drinkers ranged from \$5 to \$7.50. Grassers were from \$3.50 to \$4.25 with the bulk between \$3.60 and \$4.25.

Lambs were practically all bucks and were sold at \$6.50 to \$7 with the bulk around \$6.75.

Sheep were from \$2.50 to \$4 with the bulk between \$3.50 and \$4.25.

Hogs were stronger, selling at \$9.25 for bacon fed and watered. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium over the usual cuts on off grades.

Sows were from \$6.25 to \$7 with an odd one up to \$7.25.

Wool was from \$1.25 to \$1.50.
