Dr. McLellan's Address

(Continued)
This is only one phase of education nor must we look upon it as complete. As human nature is essentially the same in every age, we must learn from the lessons of the past and realize that the method which proved itself the best for training the human mind in the ages gone by which were so fruitful with the highest achievements of human intellect, will be found to produce the best results even in our day. Intellectual education means wider vision obtained by the correct training of our mental powers. Specialization tends to intensify the vision only in one direction, and unless it is preceded by a general education enabling a man to visualize things correctly, it will narrow his vision. The tradition of the centuries bears testimony to the efficacy of the Classics as a medium for training our mental powers, nor can we afford to break with this tradition and the results obtained for newer methods which are proving inadequate. We hold that before special scientific study is undertaken, the mind should first be trained by a classical education, which

will give breadth of vision and sense of judgment to safeguard the students from being carried away by the innumerable hypotheses and theories put forward by so-called scientists. And, moreover all education to be complete should include the training of the will power by which character is developed which should be the end and aim of all true education. Knowledge, the adornment of the intellect will not suffice alone, for it is not enough to know what is good and what is evil, but we must be trained so that with readiness and alacrity we shall do that which is good and avoid what is evil. As education is a development of our faculties, it should not only teach us the right principles which are the forms and standards of our acts, but it should also train us so that regularly and uniformly our acts would correspond with these standards. The education here imparted is three fold, physical, intellectual and moral and if we were to analyze its various parts and see how they are intended to develop the entire individual both as regards his physical and mental well-being and then compare their relative values, while asserting that all three are necessary yet we deem, that when compared one with another, the most valuable part is the moral education or direct training for character formation. This is the element of their education which will produce enduring results and qualify them to fulfill their duties and obligations to God, to their country and to their fellow men.

We all seem to be glad to see the end of the school year approach. The student looks forward to the prospect of a pleasant vacation, to the teacher it is a time of needful rest from the wearing and exacting duties of his calling. This is especially true in an institution where the students are in residence, such as ours, and where the members of the faculty are overburdened with work. It is only by strenuous effort with a self sacrificing spirit on the part of the faculty that the required work can be accomplished here. It is my pleasant duty to bear grateful testimony of the spirit of devotion to work and keen solicitude for the interest of the institution, which animates all the members of the faculty and made last year a very successful one from every point of view.

Your education, however, is by no means completed for your faculties were developed in order that you could now with security continue your education. It was the aim of your training to give you a thirst for knowledge and show you how to acquire it. You were taught the necessity of determining your actions with a clear view of your ultimate destiny. The necessity of the love of God and

the love of your neighbor abiding in your heart was continually before you. You have given us ample evidence that those lessons begun at your mother's knee and continued here, are deeply impressed upon your soul. It is, therefore, with confidence that your Alma Mater sends you forth today. You will find the world far different from what your youthful fancies pictured it. You will be surprised at the selfishness of men

and you will be astonished to find how many men are moved rather by their passions than by their reason. However, if you keep the principles you have been taught clear in your mental vision, and make your deeds accord with them we have every confidence in your ultimate success. Efforts put forth and not results obtained constitute the true measure of success. Be then men of action, possessed of a knowledge of what to do and a

will to do it. Your opportunities have been greater than others, consequently your obligations to render service to your fellowmen are still greater. Your intellectual attainments compare most favorably with those of any who have ever been graduated from the Halls, consequently, we feel assured that you will be true Christians, worthy citizens, and loyal sons of whom your Alma Mater may be justly proud.

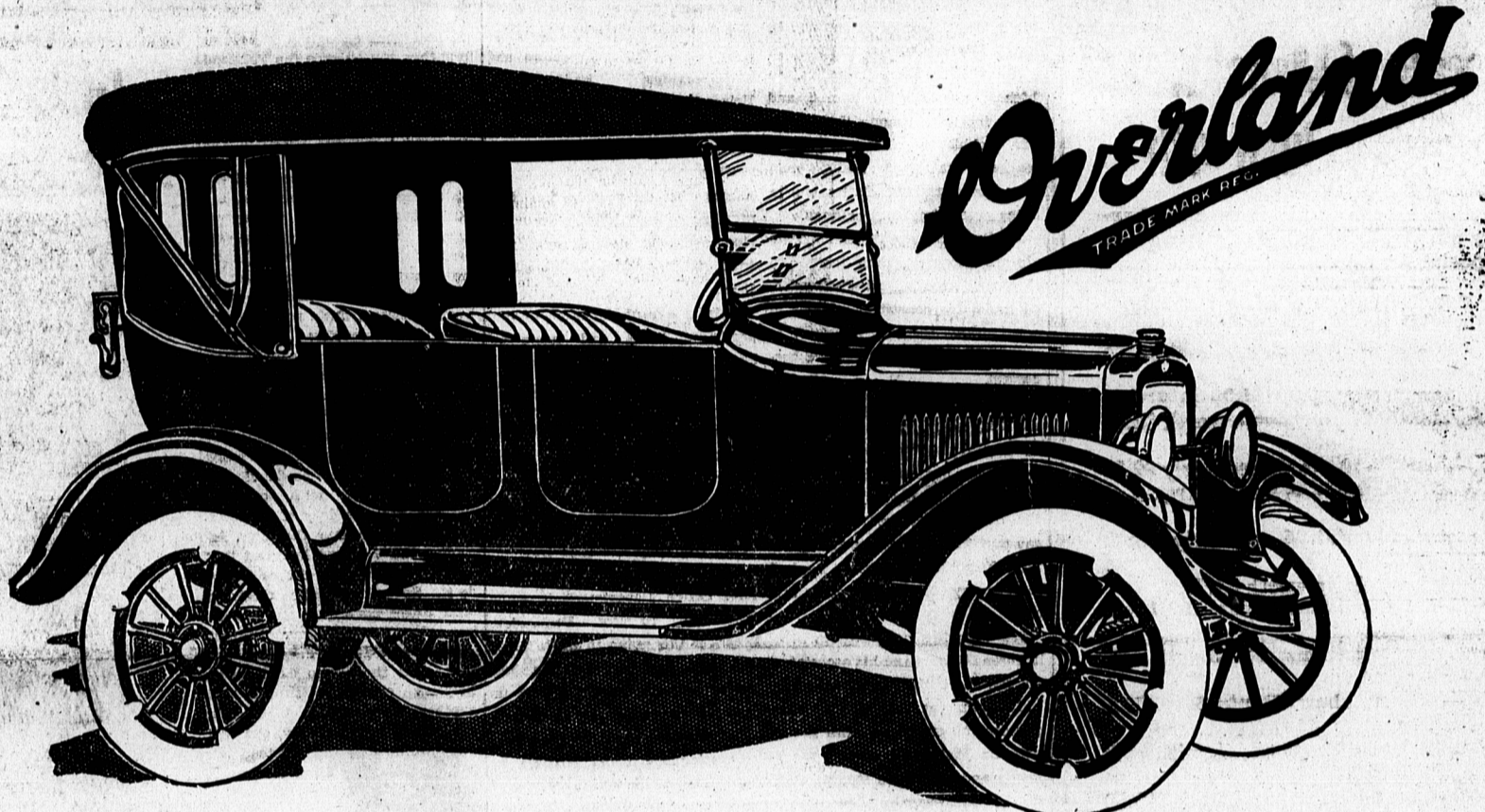
