A LOCK CANAL AT PANAMA.

Immediately on the purchase by the United States of the rights and properties of the French company which had begun the construction of the Panama Canal the question arose whether the work should be excavated throughout at sea level, or locks be used to get over the backbone of the isthmus. De Lesseps had first undertaken the work as a sea level canal but owing to the immense cost involved had changed his plans to a canal with locks.

The Commissioners appointed by President Roosevelt to report upon the work by a large majority recommended the excavation to sea level, urging in support of this plan that while much the more costly in construction there would be greatly decreased cost in maintenance and operation and a considerable saving in time to ships passing through. Five foreign and three American engineers on foot took this view of the case.

President Roosevelt has, however, decided in favor of a lock canal and a lock canal it will be. The controlling considerations with the President appear to be these: 1. A lock canal can be built under the present law. 2. Amendments are dangerous, and should be avoided when possible. 3. A lock canal can be built in about half the time and for about half the money that would be required for a canal at the level of the sea. The factors of time, cost, and the uncertainty of what Congress might do if it once began to amend have decided the matter.

Much regret is felt and expressed because of this decision and yet it may be that it is a wise one. The work in any case will be a very costly one, and it is admitted that a sea level canal would cost enormously and require many additional years for completion. There is a growing impatience to have the construction begun—"to see the dirt fly," as the President once put it—and there would have been more before the completion of a plan which might require twenty years. In that time many things might happen. The canal with locks will be the more likely of the two to be carried through without interruption.

It is implicitly the right thing to give our abundant food supply \$25,000 worth of flour to starving Japan, our next neighbor and brave ally across the Pacific. It will also be a good advertisement for Canada and will help to develop our trade in the east.

THE UNSIGHTLY JAIL.

Pretty nearly everybody who is out of jail—and this includes a large proportion of our best citizens—would like to see the unsightly local prison house removed beyond the city limits. The present structure is not attractive to the residents in the West End, it is not creditable to the City nor can it be a source of pride to the Provincial Government. It shares with the Poor House the dishonor of being a public institution of whose outward appearance our people are ashamed.

The Parliament Building, Court House, Post Office, Market Building and City Hall are all fairly creditable structures and several of them something better than that. The others must be brought up to the standard. We believe the Government realizes this fact, and we think Mayor Paton's suggestion a good one that the City Council in a body shall wait upon the Government and discuss the matter. A new Jail is needed and another site for it. It need not be a large structure as our prisoners are few.

Our Artillery men appear to have won everything in sight in the general efficiency competition for 1905. And they do it again. This is no doubt a little discouraging for the Mainlanders, but if they evince a proper spirit they will no doubt improve. First, second and third prizes to the Island; to the rest of Canada nothing! It was almost too easy.

There will be a short appropriate service at the Soldiers' Monument tomorrow after the conclusion of the morning services in the various churches. The soldiers who did service in South Africa will in the morning attend worship at St. James' Church and then proceed to the Monument where they will bestow a wreath in memory of their dead comrades. Floral offerings from citizens may be appropriately tendered at the same time. No doubt the attendance will be large.

PRINCE ARTHUR OF CONNAUGHT WELCOMED BY JAPANESE

TOKIO, Feb. 22.—The arrival of Prince Arthur of Connaught, coming to present the Order of the Garter to the Japanese Emperor, is the occasion of unprecedented evidences of rejoicing.

Contrary to all customs the Emperor himself received Prince Arthur at the Shitetsu Station. The platform was crowded with court dignitaries and officers in full uniform. The decorations there consisted of Union Jacks and Rising Suns.

The city was decorated with flags, lanterns, flowers and triumphal arches. After the arrival of the imperial train yesterday Prince Arthur and the Emperor exchanged cordial greetings. Prince Arthur was driven in a court carriage to Kasumigasaki Palace, accompanied by Crown Prince Arisugawa and escorted by the Imperial Lancers and military bands playing the British Anthem.

The arrival of the train was the signal for the firing of a royal salute. Higaya Park and the route from the Kasumigasaki Palace were lined with thousands of persons, who gave the Prince an enthusiastic welcome. The day was observed as a general holiday, and the
