A TELEGRAM received yesterday from Cranbrook, B. C., announced that Donald McKeeney was slightly improved.

SCHOONER SENOVAR, 82 tons, and schooner **LYDIA RIDER**, 57 tons, of Arichat, C. B., left West Point, P. E. Island, on August 30th. Both vessels were in ballast and bound for New Richmond, Quebec, to load railway ties. On Sunday, 22nd, the vessels went ashore at St. Mary's, twelve miles from Miramichi, during thick weather, the captains being misled by the tides. The vessels went ashore within fifteen minutes of each other and lay about two hundred yards apart. The captains and crews of the two vessels reached Eastport, Monday evening by the Carquet Railway and were sent to Muirgrave.

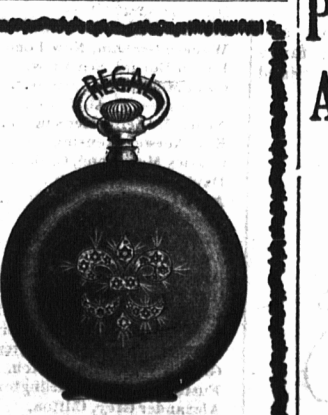
