THE COOK'S CORNER

BEEF-VEGETABLE LOAF

One and one-half pounds round steak put through the mincer, 1 slightly beaten egg, 1 cup soft bread crumbs, 1-2 cup finely chopped onion, 1-4 cup finely chopped green celery, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1-2 teaspoon summer savory, 1-2 cup vegetable soup. Combine all ingredients, and bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour in a greased loaf cake pan. Serve with mushroom sauce.

CHEESE TOAST

(12 to 14 slices of bread) One pound cheese, 1 cup rich milk or cream 2 tablespoons flour mixed with 2 tablespoons water, 2 eggs, 4 drops tabasco sauce, or a few grains of cayenne pepper, a little onion juice, if desired, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoons baking powder.

SPANISH RICE

3-4 cup rice 2 tablespoons fat 5 cups boiling water 2 onions, chopped 2 cups tomatoes 1-4 cup chopped green pepper Salt and pepper Paprika Method: Pick over, wash and drain the rice. Fry the rice in fat until brown, then add the water and simmer with frequent stirrings until the rice is tender. Drain well and cook the chopped onions in this until delicately brown, then add the tomatoes and chopped green pepper, then combine with the cooked rice, the seasonings, and place in a greased casserole. Bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for about 30 minutes.

PRUNE-BRAN BREAD

2-3 cup prune juice 2 cups all bran 2-3 cup buttermilk 1-2 cup sugar 1-2-1/2 cup shortening 1 egg 1-4 cup flour 1-4 teaspoon salt 1-1/2 teaspoons soda 2-3 cup cooked prunes, chopped 1-3 cup chopped nuts Method: Mix the all bran in a bowl and add the prune juice and the buttermilk. Allow to stand while preparing the rest of the ingredients.
