MURRAY River and Sturgeon are considerably worked up over two robberies which occurred a few days ago. The store of Mr. Thos. L. Cooke, Murray River, was entered and a quantity of goods stolen therefrom. The store of Horatio Graham, at Sturgeon, was entered and a cash box containing \$60 taken therefrom. Yesterday the city police were endeavoring to locate a young man, who arrived in the city in the morning and who is supposed to have committed the deed.

Accordingly they secured Police Officer Wilson, who forced an entrance and took the men out. Officer Louis Nickerson came along and the men were taken to the station. The reward was £1 on each.—Hx. REV. T. F. FULLERTON, pastor of St. James' Church, Charlotte Town, Chaplain of the Canadian Contingent, arrived in Quebec Sunday, and preached in the evening in St. Andrew's Church.
