RING DOWN THE CURTAIN

Realism on the Stage That Has Not Been Part of the Play

The tragic end of the famous 'cello player and actor, Mr. Auguste Van Biene thrilled all the playgoing world appearing in "The Master Musician," at a Brighton music-hall, he had just finished playing "Home, Sweet Home." At its conclusion the curtain rings down as the musician collapses in his chair. It did; but it never rose again that evening. The world-famous player was dead.

Perhaps the most notable of all stage deaths was that of the famous actor, Sir Henry Irving. The last words he uttered on the stage were the words that end "Becket," the play in which he was then appearing at Bradford. Though he did not actually die on the stage, he barely left the theatre when he was suddenly stricken with syncope, and died a few minutes later.

Very sudden was the death of a famous dancer at a Dusseldorf theatre, six years ago.

Mile, la Papimada was executing the last steps of her dance, and when she sank on the stage with a low cry of pain, her death, which occurred almost instantaneously, was watched by the crowded audience, who had no idea that a tragedy had been enacted before their eyes.

One of the most dramatic of all stage deaths was that of the great Edmund Kean. He was playing Othello to the Iago of his son Charles, at a time when his health was so frail that his weakness and incapacity could hardly be hidden from the audience. After the words "Othello's occupation's gone," he fell into his son's arms muttering, "God, I am dying. Speak to them, Charles!" He was at once carried home, and died seven weeks later.

A grim accidental tragedy occurred in 1891 at Manchester, during a school performance of "Romeo and Juliet." In the quarrel scene, the youngster playing Tybalt killed Romeo.

The famous Peg Woffington met on the stage a fate almost as sad, when playing Rosalind. She had gone alone through the entire play, with a life and spirit that gave no sign of the weakening powers plainly evident to her companions on the stage, when suddenly she staggered and fell, apparently lifeless, but in reality paralysed. She recovered, only to live three years in solitary retirement.

It is seldom that a deliberate murder takes place on the stage; but one that took place in Paris a few years ago caused a great sensation in the French capital. A clown named Hougrout had taken a liking to the voice of a child of nine, and had her trained for six years. After her debut he discovered that he loved her. She refused to marry him, however, saying she loved Pippo, a singer who had recently joined the company in which she was singing. While the girl and her lover were singing a duet together at rehearsal, Hougrout drew a revolver, and fired four shots at them.

A COAL MINER'S LUCK

He Won the \$230,000 Prize in Hungarian State Lottery.

Albert Billingham, a miner, of Old Hill, Staffordshire, says he will go down the mine no more. He has no occasion to, for he was lucky enough to win \$230,000 in a Hungarian State lottery.

Billingham left Old Hill about three years ago to take up the position of assistant foreman in the Namdang Mine, Margherita, Upper Assam, and while there he was persuaded to enter a Government lottery under the auspices of the Benko Bank, Buda-Pest. At the time he hardly understood the regulations, and, though he took the ticket, he thought no more about the lottery.

Three days before Mr. Billingham left India for home he received a letter from the promoters of the lottery giving a list of the prize-winners, from which he found that his number, 103,881, was the winner of prize money and a bonus which is roughly estimated at \$236,000. While on his way home, Billingham communicated with the Benko Bank, requesting that the money should be forwarded to him at Old Hill.

Before leaving for India Billingham was employed as a miner at No. 30 Colliery, Cradley Heath. He is very reluctant to answer questions as to what he intends to do with the money, but on one point he is very emphatic, that he will not again risk his life in a coal mine.

Platlayer's Amazing Escape

A middle-aged platlayer named John Donaghan had a remarkable escape from death at Stirling Station. He was working on the line when he failed to observe the approach of the four o'clock passenger train to Edinburgh. He was knocked down and run over, and when extricated it was found that no limbs had been severed, his injuries consisting of severe cuts and bruises to the head and face and crushing of the ribs.

A 49 Pound Salmon

One of the finest specimens of salmon ever caught in the blackwater has been captured by Mr. Fitz Smith at Kilmurry, near Fermoy. The fish measured 4 feet from nose to tail and 8 feet 2 inches around the girth, and weighed exactly 49 pounds.

TIBERIUS CAESAR'S HOUSE

Interesting Discovery in Recent Excavations at Palatine

Another of Professor Boni's discoveries in his excavations of Palatine is reported. He has re-opened a house of the early Imperial period, which was partly uncovered in 1730, and subsequently reburied. Professor Boni is convinced from the inscriptions and other evidence that it was the residence of Tiberius Caesar and Julia, the daughter of Augustus. Amongst the minor evidences which he has discovered are luxurious fittings, which correspond to the capricious, exacting character of Julia, who, according to Suetonius, Tiberius reluctantly married. A large bath and hot and cold water supplies are among the fittings. There is an underground cell beneath the house, which Professor Boni tentatively identifies as the prison where Drusus starved to death as narrated by Tacitus.

RESPECTED IN DEATH

Frederick Hitch Who Participated in the Famous "Rorke's Drift"

Not for many years has a military funeral attracted so much public attention, and homage for the dead man, as the burial of Frederick Hitch, one of the recipients of the Victoria Cross, and one of the noble band of heroes who thrilled the world by their bravery in the great fight at Rorke's Drift.

The old hero suddenly and peacefully collapsed, passing away in the arms of a friend. At the funeral, full military honors were accorded to the dead man. The remains were placed on a gun carriage, drawn by four horses. The coffin was borne from the house where the hero died on the shoulders of six of his comrades from the old regiment and was received with a salute by the firing party, which had been drawn up opposite to and facing the gun carriage. Then the Union Jack was draped over the casket, and the procession moved off at slow march, the drums softly rolling out the introduction to the sweetly solemn strains of the band, playing the Dead March.
