LABOR TROUBLES AT MONTREAL ARE IMPROVED.

MONTREAL, June 19.—Local labor conditions were further ameliorated today by the removal of the 1,200 sugar refinery workers from the list of strikers in this city and the settlement with all but three of the packing houses. The Canadian Vickers, Dominion Textile and the electrician strikes, however, remain about the same. While there is no immediate prospect of a settlement of the first two disputes, the third, that of the electricians, is at present the most threatening as there is increasing danger of all the building trades being drawn into the strike. There is no thing further to report and no further move has been made by the representatives of the railway shop men.

NOTED ENGLISH PHYSICIAN SAYS PROHIBITION IS NONSENSE

PHILADELPHIA, June 18.—"Prohibition is absolute nonsense," Sir St. Clair Thomson, noted English physician, declared here today. Dr. Thomson was a representative of the British Medical Association to the convention of the American Medical Association at Atlantic City. In company with other physicians he is making a tour of the medical centres of the United States.

"The arbitrary denial of alcoholic stimulants could not and never would be done in England, and I am sure it would not be successful here," he said. "Men of all nations from the beginning to the end of time have used alcohol as a stimulant. Used in moderation, it is a good thing. Deny it to all on account of the excesses of the few, and the people will take to opium, hashish, tobacco, in excess, or other drugs."

ENGLISH-SPEAKING LEADERS TO BE TRIED IN COURTS

WINNIPEG, June 19.—The Winnipeg Telegram, in an extra edition issued tonight says: "At an important conference of government authorities this afternoon it was decided to place the arrested English-speaking leaders of the strike upon civil trial in the local courts. In the event of their conviction on charges of seditious libel their deportation will be urged on the minister of immigration. Hon. J. A. Calder, and left to his decision. It was originally intended solely to have a board of enquiry under the Immigration Act to deal with the cases, but the change in procedure was decided upon on the representation of a government agent sent up from Ottawa. The course of action applies only to the English-speaking men, such as Ivens, Russell, Queen and Heaps."

POUGHKEEPSIE, N. Y., June 18.—The horses which were prepared for their Grand Circuit engagements over the Hudson River Driving Park have been shipped to Cleveland. Murphy has a strong stable of aged horses, Ante Guy, Directum J., and Royal Mae being the top liners. Last Friday Ante Guy and Royal Mae worked in 2.09 1/4, last half in 1.01. Directum J., Sanardo, and Direct C. Burnett paced in 2.06, last half in 1.01, the black horse being under restraint at the finish. He will pace in two minutes the first time he turns for the word. While Miss Harris M., Single G., and Napoleon Direct have nibbled a little off the second minute, they will have to be on edge to trim him. Sanardo has as much speed but is shy on racing experience. Murphy also has another great pair of racing pacers in Ethel Chimes and Esther R. Goldie King will represent the stable in the three year old pacing events. She has a two year old mark on 2.11 1/4.

Fenesta now looks like Murphy's stake trotter. Ruby Aubrey is lame. Lotto Wait's is up to a mile in 2.10, while Baird and Petrex are ready. Of the three year olds, Harveta reduced her record to 2.03 1/4 Saturday, and Liberty Maid worked in 2.16. Dark Flower looks like the best three year old at present. Practically all of the two year olds, including Evening Gale, the Peter the Great filly that worked a mile in 2.25 1/4 last month, have been left here.
