**BELGRADE, March 12.**—The Turkish cruiser T. Hamakieh bombarded the port of Durazzo at noon to-day although it is an unfortified place.  
 The cruiser then proceeded to San Grovan De Medua which she also bombarded. It is not known whether damage was inflicted.  
 The Hamakieh then disappeared in the direction of the Italian coast. Her activity causes alarm here as a large number of Serbian troops are now being transported to the Adriatic to assist the Montenegrins in their attack on Scutari.

**ST. JOHNS, Nfld., March 12.**—Newfoundland's annual seal hunt began to-day when the first division of the sealing fleet sailed.  
 Owing to the early presence of drift

ice in the Gulf of St. Lawrence and off the Grand Banks, the fact that seals were sighted several weeks ago is taken as an indication of a good season.  
 The seal hunt this year will employ over a thousand men. Nearly all the vessels are equipped with wireless service, shore stations being arranged through which owners may keep in touch with the fleet at all times.

**PERTH, Ont., Mar. 12.**—John C. Ebbs, Conservative, David McLean, Liberal and W. G. Ferguson, Independent were nominated today in the contest for the vacancy in the Ontario Legislature for South Lanark, caused by the death of the late Col. Mathieson.

**SKAGWAY, March 12.**—It is reported that there is a big strike of placer gold miners near Tehlin Lake.

**OTTAWA, March 12.**—Leading hotel men from every part of the Dominion waited on Hon. C. J. Doherty, Minister of Justice, today, seeking amendment to the criminal code to provide for a fine of \$100 or thirty days in jail for anyone who pays the dead-beat game.  
 The minister promised to give the matter consideration.  
 Later in the day a Dominion organization was completed called the Hotel Keepers Association of the Dominion of Canada.

 The Executive includes R. H. Sterns, Charlottetown, James Fairbanks, Halifax and F. H. McIntyre, St. John.

**CONSTANTINOPLE, March 12.**—Serious fighting has been in progress along the Bulair frontier since yesterday. The Turkish fleet is co-operating with the troops.

**BERLIN, March 11.**—Finance Ministers of the Federated German states have unanimously agreed to introduce an army vote. The initial expenditures will be covered by a non-recruiting general property.

**RHEIMS, France, March 11.**—Nestor Wilmart, former manager of Grand Tannazien Railroad, who fled from Brussels in October 1912, after defalcations aggregating millions of dollars was arrested here to-day.

**CHENG, China, March 11.**—Two merchants were executed here yesterday for secretly storing opium.  
 Four officers were killed in Kien Chow while attempting to force farmers to destroy their poppy crops.

**NOTTINGHAM, March 11.**—Hostile crowds broke up a suffragette meeting here to-night.  
 Miss Annie Kenny and others attempted to speak and could not get a hearing. Windows were smashed, banners torn down and the platform stoned. The police took the speaker out by a rear door to escape the violence of the mob.

**MONTRECY, Mexico, March 11.**—Federal troops are reported to have driven a large body of adherents of Carranlas back toward Mazquis, after a fight Sunday at San Salvador Bonavides in the state of Colhuatla. Many Indians are joining the Carranzas.

**PORTLAND, March 11.**—Rear Admiral Peary will sail next Saturday from New York for Rome where he will be presented with a gold medal by the Royal Italian Geographical Society of Rome in honor of the discovery of the North Pole.

**CAPE TRAVERS, March 11.**—Mr. Ritchie of Carvell Bros and Mr. Bud, representing Ganongs chocolates, are in Cape Traverser in the interests of their firms.

**LONDON, March 11.**—Ambassadors of the European powers met in the Foreign Office to-day and discussed the general situation in the near east.  
 In the absence of a reply from the Balkan nations on the subject of mediation which Turkey had already applied for nothing was done.  
 Another meeting will be held Thursday when it is hoped the diplomats will act independent of a reply from the allies.

**LONDON, March 11.**—European chancelleries and stock markets are being kept in a condition of nervous tension. No sooner does one thorny problem seem in the way of solution when another crops up.  
 To-night the long expected agreement on the Austro-Russian demobilization was published. The allies have accepted the powers' offer of mediation under the conditions and arrangements that have been completed for settlement of the dispute between Bulgaria and Roumania by the conference of ambassadors at St. Petersburg.  
 Thus the way seems prepared for the restoration of peace in the Balkans. At the same moment a new difficulty has been raised by Austria which objects to Serbia going to the assistance of Montenegro and is endeavoring to send the Powers to her with the idea to coerce Serbia. Further, Austria declines to demobilize as far as the Serbian frontier is concerned. It appears, therefore, that the fate of Scutari is still a menace to the peace of Europe.  
 Austria is determined to make Scutari the capital of the autonomy of Albania. Montenegro is equally insistent on the possession of Scutari. In the present temper of the allies it is hardly likely that Serbia will desert in her effort to go to Montenegro's assistance at Austria's bidding.  
 Greek transports are with a large Serbian force near Scutari and these will make a general attack on the town next week.  
 Fighting has been resumed at Tohatalla and Bulair where the Bulgarians attacked both wings.

**NORTH SYDNEY, N. S. Mar. 11.**—An emergency meeting of the Board of Health has closed all churches, schools and places of amusement, owing to the rapid spread of diphtheria in the town.  
 The disease is not of the malignant type but seems highly contagious.  
 Four new cases were reported yesterday which brings the total up to sixteen.
