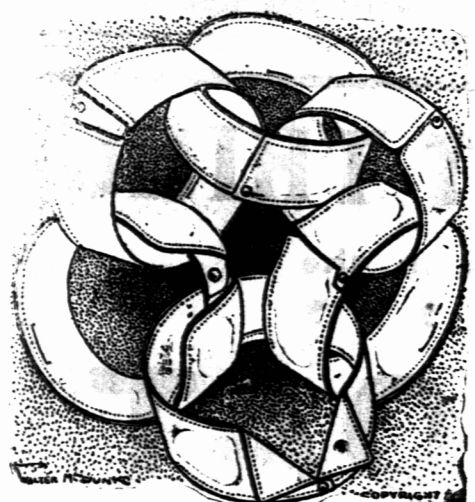

CAVENDISH CHURCH OPENING.—The Cavendish Baptists opened their new house of worship on Sunday with appropriate services, though the weather was cold and unfavorable large audiences attended all the services, it being impossible to crowd in seats enough to accommodate all who came out in the evening. The church is a neat, comfortable building, very artistic in design and finished in an excellent manner throughout. George E. Baker is the architect and J. M. Clark & Co. contractors. The work has been most satisfactorily done from foundation to finish. The total cost is close upon two thousand dollars, of which about three hundred remains to be provided for, Sunday's collections amounting to sixty dollars and twenty cents. The weather had been so unfavorable on Saturday that friends from outside the community who had planned to be present found it impossible to do so. When it is known that the church contains but fifteen families their heroic efforts in building will be the more appreciated. The dedicatory sermon was preached by Rev. D. H. Simpson, formerly of Bay View, now in King's County, N. S., and the prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Spurr of Pownal who was pastor at Cavendish for over ten years. The sermon was a splendid presentation of Gospel truth and came with the power of the Holy Spirit, the theme of the speaker; the Spirit of God is present with his people to perfect the individual life and lead God's people in the forefront of every praiseworthy undertaking. In the afternoon Rev. M. H. MacIntosh spoke from "Let the children of Zion be joyful in their King" and in the evening Rev. J. C. Spurr spoke from the words of Jonah where he almost accuses God of being too merciful to sinners, both were excellent presentations of Gospel truth.

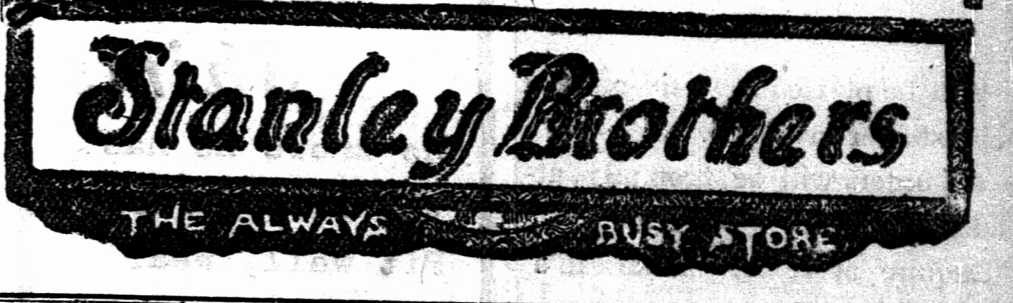
