**BAPTIST DENOMINATION NOTES.**—At the present time there are forty-three fields or circuits in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island needing assistance for Home Mission funds. In a number of cases it is only one church of the group that is aided directly by the Board, the other churches being self-supporting. They may be classified as follows: In the limits of the Western Association there are three full mission groups and churches receiving aid, attached to six other groups; in the Central Association twelve full mission groups; in the Eastern thirteen full mission groups, and dependent churches connected with two others; and in the Prince Edward Island Association five full mission groups, and dependent churches forming part of two other groups. The number of churches aided directly by the Board is seventy-five and the whole number in the forty-three fields is ninety-two. To keep all these fields supplied with pastoral labor throughout the year, according to the present rate of grants, means an outlay of \$4,445. But in some cases the grants should be larger so as to make up respectable salaries consequently in order to make suitable provision for this part of our Home Mission work in the two provinces named above there should be an annual expenditure of at least \$5,500.—Messenger and Visitor.

**Dr. Carman is Patriotic.**

HAMILTON, Jan. 15.—Yesterday the Rev. doctor took occasion to deny the report that he had made the statement while preaching at Barrie two weeks ago that the reverses which the British army had suffered in South Africa were the judgments of God for Britain's sins. He had never



said such a thing, and he did not believe the weeping widows were under the judgment of God. He did not think that any man spoke aright who said that God was against Great Britain in this war. The doctor said in South Africa were an intimation that the British forces were not impregnable, and that there was such a thing possible as the British being put to the test to teach a lesson of humility. He expressed a wish to see a victory, not only of British arms, but of righteousness and truth.

The present House of Commons of the United Kingdom was elected in July and August 1895. The total number of members is 670 of whom 465 represent England, with 30 for Wales, 72 for Scotland and 103 for Ireland. The number of electors is 6,600,283, of whom 4,917,980 are in England, 290,157 in Wales, 671,128 in Scotland and 721,018 in Ireland. The Emerald Isle has a much larger representation in proportion to population than either England or Scotland.

Some months ago four or five gentlemen were assembled in THE GUARDIAN office and while waiting for the latest news from the front amused themselves by pencilling down the dates when Pretoria would be captured by the British troops. One sanguine military man set the date at New Years days, while other guesses were in March, May and July respectively. At least one of these dates is now known to have been too early, but the Old Flag will get there after a while all the same.

La Semaine Religieuse, which recently published a disloyal tirade against the British Government and at the same time denounced the United States, is as bitter against the Laurier Government as it is hostile to the Queen. Other French Conservative journals have also been of late very outspoken in their sympathy for the enemies of the Empire. Sir Wilfrid is being denounced daily by these organs in a manner that is calculated greatly to strengthen his already strong position in the hearts of the loyal people of Canada.
