UNCLE SAM HAS A FLEET OF FIGHTERS NEW YORK, November, 1.—"The fleet has demonstrated its preparedness for any emergency and has shown the effectiveness of the present organization." George Von L. Meyer, secretary of the navy smiled as he made this statement this evening on board the yacht Mayflower after having inspected ninety-nine fighting ships of the Atlantic fleet, assembled in the Hudson river, for the greatest mobilization in the history of the American navy. President Taft will review the fleet tomorrow as it passes out to sea. And the palisades and the shores of the Hudson will each back a greater number of salutes than was accorded the secretary today but knowing the more spectacular event to come, Mr. Meyer says that he is satisfied with what he saw today.

Leading the Mayflower in a speedy admiral's launch, after having received on board Rear Admiral Catherhaus, the commander-in-chief and the division commander, the secretary paid visits to the flagships of the fleet. His calls completed, the secretary boarded the Mayflower, which had steamed up to the upper end of the seven miles of warships and passed slowly southward along the entire line, each ship saluting nineteen times as he passed. The echoes roared back from the New York shore as it seemed an interval so long that it seemed as if a second bombardment were going on in the streets of Harlem. It was 5.10 p. m., when he had passed the Connecticut on his return trip marking the end of the day's formalities. "This mobilization has also demonstrated," continued Secretary Meyer, "that for our reserve fleet we should have a greater number of enlisted men. I have anticipated this in part by asking for 2,000 more men in this year's estimates, which have now gone to the treasury department. These estimated provides for the maintenance and addition of these men, but they are no larger than those of last year." Besides the congressmen and other prominent guests who were aboard the Mayflower, this afternoon there were the attaches of four foreign nations.

They decided to hold a number of sales for the benefit of the Hospital.—S. —The schooner James Stetson was driven ashore by a north east wind near the Cascumpeque Light House on Wednesday morning and will probably be a total loss. She was endeavoring to enter the harbour and owing to the loss of her fore-sail and main boom, which occurred during the previous night, of Kildare Cape, she became helpless in the heavy sea and wind. She was commanded by Capt Frank Smith who with three other men had considerable difficulty in landing in a little boat after the vessel grounded. The Stetson is about 70 tons and was to load produce at Alberton by the Daniel Moreshead of Cleary. The Captain is one of the oldest coasters in this province. This trip he intended to be his last; and never before losing a vessel during his many years of following the sea, naturally he feels the loss very keenly. The vessel was uninsured.—A.

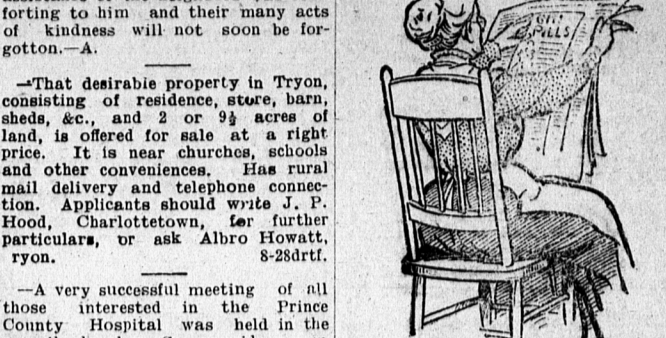
