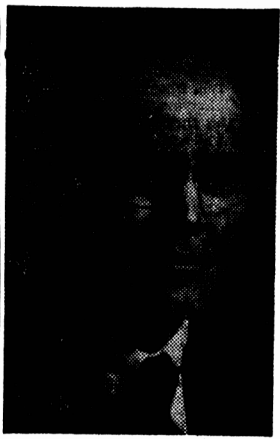
To Consolidate Civic Statutes

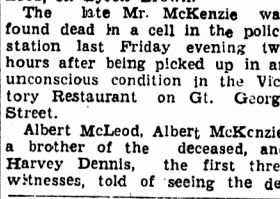
Asks People To Help Battle Fire Menace
