Grierson Makes Things Hum In British Films

By Norma Cribbens LONDON, June 19 — (C P) — Much praised, sometimes much criticized, stocky 50-year-old John Grierson is making things hum in the films division of the British Government's central office of information. Formerly head of Canada's National Film Board, Grierson now supervises the planning, production and distribution of documentary films that interpret British social and industrial life to audiences at home and abroad. Many are being sent to Canada and the United States. His appointment as controller of the Films Division last February was criticized by a Conservative member of the House of Commons who said "his affiliation with the extreme left is well known, particularly on the other side of the Atlantic."

Patrick Gordon-Walker, Parliamentary under-secretary for Commonwealth relations, replied that Grierson had served under a Liberal administration in Canada for seven years, and was unquestionably "the right man for the job." Four films made under Grierson's supervision are to be seen in Canada soon. Three deal vividly and imaginatively with work in British shipyards, the Sheffield cutlery industry and the Midlands potteries. The fourth shows how relations between factory managers and workers can be improved. "Britain's chief problem today is economic, so most of our films will deal with economic problems."

These, he said, come under four broad categories: 1. Those that report to the citizen the state of national, financial and industrial machinery. 2. Those that deal with Britain's relation to the rest of the world. 3. Those dealing with worker-management relations. 4. Those affecting national morale.

Commons Committee Hears Plaints From Veterans Groups

OTTAWA, June 19 — (CP) — The Commons committee on veterans affairs heard the complaints of two groups of veterans today as it rounded off a long, occasionally hectic session that has seen important revisions in the rates of pensions and war veterans allowances. One delegation represented the 1,415 survivors of the Canadian forces that went to Hong Kong and asked that they be given, retroactively, the higher rates of pay that were promised men who volunteered for the abortive Pacific force in 1945. Three or four of them are on pension for disabilities. The other asked clear titles for the 2,879 veterans of the First World War who still owe the gov-
