To be sure it contrasts charmingly with the color of a hat is becoming, one dark hair and eyes but only to the detriment of an olive skin. If the shopper has set her heart upon a white hat let her have the brim faced with black velvet, besides being very fashionable this season, makes a soft setting for her brunette beauty.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the holder of a farm of at least 80 acres and who is 21 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by either the applicant's son, daughter, brother or sister of intended homesteader.

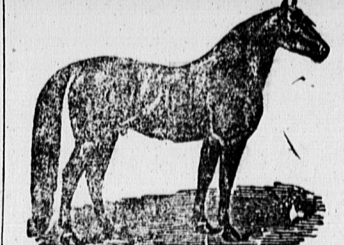
