Vegetables & Canned Fruit More Plentiful

OTTAWA, June 9 —(CP)— A more plentiful supply of canned fruit and vegetables was indicated today as the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported substantially higher stocks of these commodities held on April 1 by canners, packers, wholesale dealers and chain store warehouses. Canned fruit stocks amounted to 1,614,926 dozen cans compared with 1,209,527 a year ago, with the net weight of contents totalling 44,734,341 pounds—almost twice as much as the 23,121,494 pounds held April 1, 1946.

Stocks of canned vegetables were 7,613,509 dozen cans compared with 5,075,537, with the weight totalling 131,722,621 against 84,333,965.

Practically all varieties of canned fruits were higher this year, the principal exception being pineapple. Largest gains were shown for apples, plums and pears.

Stocks of canned foods for infants also stood in better supply, totalling 3,815,414 dozen cans April 1 compared with 2,613,862 a year ago.

Will Press Purity Campaign In Mt'l.

MONTREAL, June 9 —(CP)— Beaches are still under flood water and the weather has the nip of April, but Quebec's morality champions have renewed their drive for modesty and sobriety in private and public places this summer.

Founded last fall to clean up Montreal's morals, the League for Decency, in its first communique of the year, made it plain it will press its purity campaign even harder this year than last.

Legislative action during the winter produced ammunition for the guns of the religious and lay leaders whose belief is that there can be fun and beauty without immorality and immodesty.

The announcement, bearing the signatures of the league's joint presidents, Eugene Simard and Mrs. Willie Major, and its director, Msgr. Albert Valois, reported progress toward league objectives during the winter.

Immoral publications were ban-

ned; radio programs were cleaned up; suggestive bill-boards were altered.

"Behaviour in parks has been less scandalous as a result of police inspection, and this season signs will be erected to remind citizens they should conduct themselves in a proper manner," the league said.

"The league wishes to remind everyone that the holiday period does not constitute a period of armistice in the morality campaign," it added. "To the contrary, it is the hour to fight im-

modesty in clothes, in abuses of alcohol—the principal cause of

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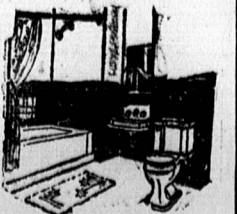
