Parliament has been in session over five months at Ottawa and the debate on reciprocity still continues, after having been drawn out to a seemingly unreasonable length. Members of the Opposition have announced their intention to further prolong it indefinitely. What shall be done? The Toronto Globe says the introduction of a system of closure seems inevitable, and that Sir Wilfrid Laurier, who has been hitherto very reluctant to apply such a measure, must now be convinced that it has become imperative.

At this distance it would seem that some other and milder expedient might be first applied, such as limitation of the length of speeches. They have some plan in one or other of the Houses of Congress at Washington under which the duration of speeches may be limited to one hour, and by graduated process may be afterward further limited to thirty, twenty and ten minutes each, where a debate is unduly prolonged. Had the House of Commons some such rule as this the reciprocity debate would long ago have come under the ten minute rule and would have been ended.

The present method of permitting every member to speak at any length of hours that he may please on every question which comes before the House is not in accord with reason or common sense. It delays the public business, while serving no good or needful purpose. And it is and has been always within the power of the House to cut short the debates in some way without resorting to such an extreme measure as shutting off discussion altogether by means of closure. It seems strange indeed that some simple plan like

THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

The Legislature was prorogued yesterday afternoon by Lieutenant Governor Rogers after a pretty long but not very eventful session. The number of important measures passed was not as large as in some previous years, one of the more important being the readjustment of the income tax so as to relieve in some measure the men of small incomes and to increase somewhat the demands upon those whose incomes are of more generous proportions.

Controversy between the two parties was maintained throughout the session with a good deal of spirit but in the main with mutual good feeling. There were a number of close divisions, but except from illness, which deprived the House for some time of the services of Mr. Palmer, and later of Mr. McDonald of George town, there was no change in the relative strength of the opposing parties during the session.

Other features of the session were the rejection of the ballot for provincial elections, the adoption by unanimous vote of a resolution calling for the restoration of our lost representation at Ottawa, of other resolutions calling upon the Dominion Government to fill the vacant Judgeship and Senatorship, and finally the adoption by a majority of one vote of a resolution endorsing the reciprocity agreement.

The session closes with the financial situation of the Province unimproved, the increased taxation not being sufficient to make our revenues adequate to provide for the admittedly necessary improvement in our school system, or to shut out the prospect of future deficits.

Another matter much in mind and frequently referred to during the session, is what seems to be the probable removal of the Premier from the political arena, with no very clear indication as to who may succeed to the Premiership. This is, however, a matter in regard to which the common expectation may be at fault, and speculation may be reserved. We may be all wiser in that regard a few days hence.

The session may also be said to have enhanced the prestige of the two leaders, who never before displayed greater industry, activity and skill in marshalling their respective forces. The Opposition were especially active in procuring information upon every subject in connection with provincial affairs and broke all records in the number of returns called for and brought down.

DETECTIVE ARRESTED CHARGE OF KIDNAPPING.

INDIANAPOLIS, April 26.—Detective Burns was yesterday served with a warrant charging complicity in the alleged kidnaping of McNamara, Secretary of the International Structural Iron Workers.

Mr Burns said that his agency had evidence to show that the McNamara gang has destroyed property ranging in value from \$300,000 to \$500,000 in the last two years, and that he would be able to prove they were guilty of not fewer than eight mysterious explosions, due to labor troubles.

MINERS ENTOMBED IN VIRGINIA

ELK GARDEN, W. Va., April 24.—Twenty-two miners are entombed in the Ctt Mine No. 2, of the Dalls Coal and Coke Company here, the result of an explosion early today, and little chance is held out for the rescue of any of them alive because of tons of debris that has thus far impeded the progress of the rescuers. It cannot be learned yet whether the explosion was caused by dust or gas. Officials of the Company say they have never known their mines to be gaseous.

As soon as the accident became known Supt. Robert Grant organized a rescue corps of the miners off duty and these attempted to enter the mine. The rescue parties had not advanced far into the workings before they discovered that it would take several days to dig through the heaps of roof coal and slate that had been loosened by the explosion.

It was then decided to effect an entrance nearer the probable point of the explosion by cutting through the wall of an adjoining mine owned by the same Company.

Late this afternoon the rescuers had penetrated to the No. 2 mine at a point about 4,000 feet from the outside entry. There still remained about the same distance to go before reaching the buried miners. The Ctt Mine No. 2 is almost directly under the town of Elk Garden which is on a hill. The mouth of the mine is about half a mile from the town.

In striking contrast to the usual mine explosions, the victims in this case, with one exception are Americans. They are John Ritchard, James Brown, John R. Wilson, Roy Wilson, Lester Wilson, William Pugh, Hawthorne Patton, Thomas Wilson, Geet White, William Pearson, John White, William Shears, Harry Tamm, Thomas Dempsey, L. O. Dempsey, Edward Hershberger, Thomas Yost, Charles Wilson, William S. Etsel, William Buskey. The latter is the mine usually employs 200 men on the day shift, and about the same number at night. A temporary suspension of work, however, required fewer men in the mines else the casualty might have been greater. Communication with the outside world is difficult, only one telephone wire being available, and that a private line of the Coal Company's which terminates three miles from here. Over this line dispatches are sent into Cumberland. Only two trains daily run between here and Cumberland and none of the officials from the headquarters in Cumberland can reach here until tomorrow. Two engines with rescue crews and equipment were sent here from Thomas, West Virginia, 15 miles away.

MONCTON, April 25.—The ten year old daughter of Thos Taylor, near Salisbury was fatally burned yesterday. While watching the burning of brush in the field, Her clothes caught fire.

The mother who was attracted by the child's screams, was badly burned in the attempt to remove the burning clothing. The child was so badly injured that she died.

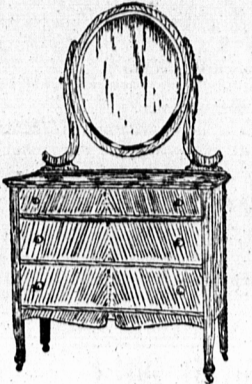
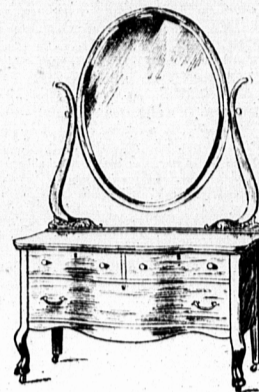
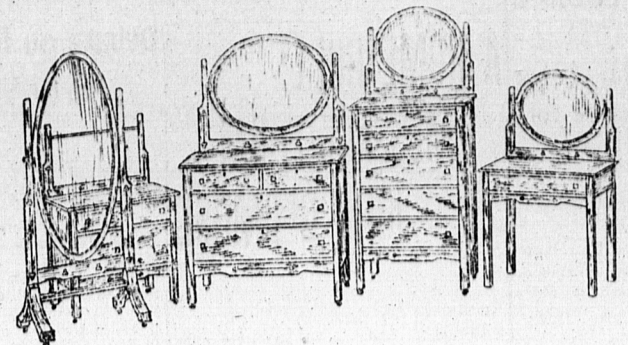
