TORONTO, Sept. 11—(CP)—The stock market trended strong this afternoon to show gains at the close for all index groups. The base metal stocks led with a gain of 39 and closed at their highest level of the year. Volume was 482,000 shares. International Nickel closed at 37 1-2 for a net gain of 3-4. Noranda added 3-4 and Smelters firmed 1-4. Sherritt firmed 9 cents to a new high at 1.05. Falconbridge added 15 cents. Normetal 7. Ventures 10 and White-Amulet 5.
 Senior golds including D. me. McIntyre and Hollinger, firmed minor fractions and the close was up a few cents for Central Patricia, Hard Rock, Little Long Lac, Mining Corporation, Premier, Sylvanite and W. A. Hargreaves. Malartic Gold firmed 8 cents and O'Brien closed 7 cents down. Moderate losses were noted by Brouhan, Chesterville, East Malartic, Francœur, Inspiration, Kerr-Addison, Lamaque, MacLeod-Cockshutt and Perron.
 Gains out-numbered the losses in the senior oil, utility, steel, liquor and implement.
 Home Oil firmed a cent and Calgary and Edmonton was off 2. Anglo-Canadian added 1 1-2 cents.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Sept. 11—(CP)—Hesitant at the commencement today trading on the stock exchange gathered confidence and closed on an upward curve. All group averages showed increases.
 Mines came from behind to finish strongly. Consolidated Smelters and International Nickel snatched up new high peaks and Noranda and Bulolo were each fractionally better. Oils were also better, with Imperial, International Petroleum and McCol posting advances.
 Most utilities were pointed up, including Montreal Power, Shawinigan, Winnipeg Electric preferred and Brazillan. Bell started in the hole and stayed there. Papers were mixed, price Brothers and St. Lawrence Corporation moving up and Bathurst and Howard Smith turning scfter.
 In transportation G.P.R. did a bit better. The Steamship preferred was on the downside. Industrials were irregular with gains up-ernmost. Algona Steel, United Steel of Canada preferred, C. K. Siscoe, Canadian Asbestos worked higher and Steel of Canada common, Foundation and the Canadian Car works were easier. Dosco "B" marked up a gain and Dominion Coal preferred cut an early loss.

 NEW YORK, Sept. 11—(AP)—The stock market today trailed rallying commodities and registered its first average advance since Sept. 2.
 The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 2 of a point at 43.3. Transfers totaled 689,250 shares.
 Specialties were principal share movers, the majority of Steels, rails, motors, coppers, oil, mail orders and airways holding to a relatively slim area.
 U.S. Rubber common and preferred retained gains of 1 3-8 and 2 1-2 points, respectively, both at new 1941 tops. Also posting new highs for the year were International Paper, International Nickel and Loew's.
 Up fractions to a point or so were United Merchants and Manufacturers, N.Y. Shipbuilding, Paramount Pictures, Standard Oil (NJ), Boeing, Glenn Martin, U.S. Steel, Republic Steel, Chrysler, Goodrich, Goodyear, American Telephone, Western Union, Anaconda, American Smelting, Union Carbide and J. I. Case.
 Losers included Dow Chemical, Eastman Kodak and Owens-Illinois.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 11—(CP)—Higher prices at Chicago induced good buying on Winnipeg grain exchange today to push wheat and coarse grain futures to higher levels in active trade. Final quotations for wheat futures were 1-4-1-8 cent higher, October at 73 7-8 cents, December 75 1-2 and May 79 5-8-3-4.

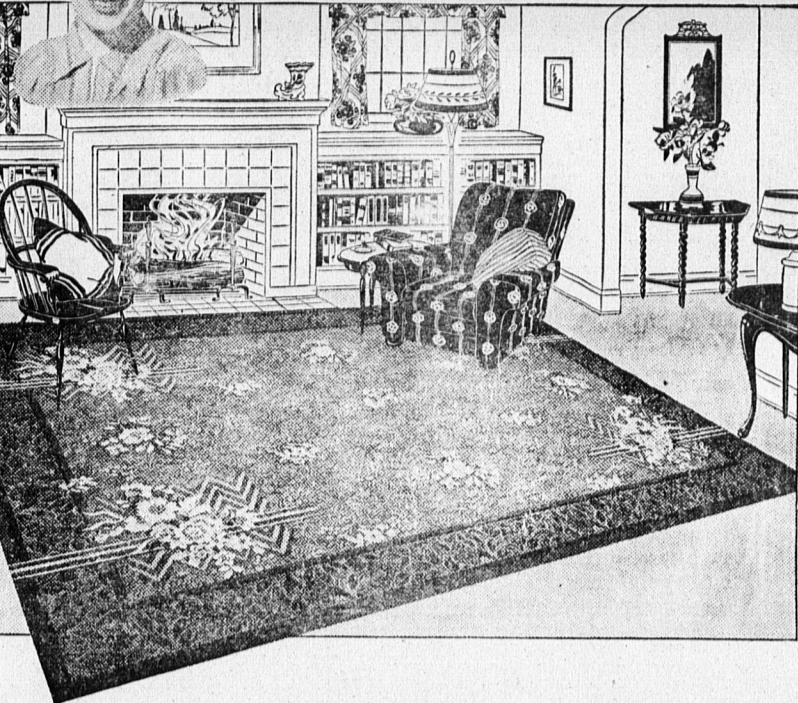
