SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 21 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions. By father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the intending homesteader. Duties: Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land to each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least six acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20 per acre.
Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre.
Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.

TUNNELS OF THE FUTURE.

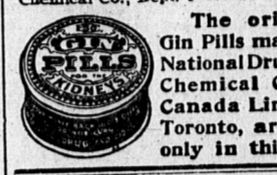

In a recent report to Washington United States Consul Frank Deedmeier at Charlottetown presents statistics in support of the project to construct a tunnel connecting Prince Edward Island with New Brunswick which cause one to marvel that there should be any hesitancy about the expenditure of the \$15,000,000 estimated to be necessary for the work. However, it is comforting to know that the supplementary estimates recently brought down in the Dominion Parliament contain a grant of \$35,000 for a survey for such a tunnel. The island, says Consul Deedmeier, now annually produces about \$10,000,000 worth of field and animal products, but owing to the uncertainties of navigation after November the farmers are forced to sell, no matter what the market then may be, shortly after their crops are harvested. All efforts to utilize it have been given up because of the impossibility of shipping goods out of the province for at least four months of the year. Regular navigation is generally closed in the middle of April and December to the middle of April. During this period ice-breaking steamers much of the time carry the mails, passengers and some freight, but often the mails are pulled over the ice on sleds.
As the distance between Cape Traverse on Prince Edward Island and Cape Tormentine in New Brunswick is but seven miles and the maximum depth is only 90 feet, there would appear nothing insurmountable in the construction of a tunnel, particularly in view of the success recently attained by the builders of tunnels under

the lower Hudson River, where much of the work consists of metal tubes laid on piers when the bed of the river, proved too soft, for boring either through rock or mud. Moreover, the substitution of electric traction for the smoke producing locomotive made it possible to use lengthy tunnels to so much greater advantage than in former decades that it should not be deemed surprising if within the next twenty years practically all numerous inhabited islands situated as is Prince Edward Island, quite apart from ice considerations, come to be connected by rail with the mainland.

OFF TO FACE PERILS IN LOVE OF SCIENCE.

On a 7,000 mile journey Prof. Henry E. Crampton, curator of the department of invertebrate zoology of the American Museum of Natural History, New York, started on Wednesday with two companions. They were bound for British Guiana and other points in South America to make a biological study of the life of those countries.
Crampton's companions are Dr. Frank E. Lutz and Roy W. Miner, assistant curators in the department of zoology. The explorers first will visit the Lesser Antilles and then go to Dominica and Georgetown, British Guiana. In Georgetown Indians will join the party.
The members of the party are prepared to face possible attacks by mountain lions and jaguars. One feat planned is to ascend Mount Roraima, which is about 8,000 feet high. It has been scaled four times before, as far as is known.
This expedition is the first of a series planned by the American Museum, to continue over a period of ten years. Dr. Crampton has made important trips for the museum, including four voyages to the South Pacific seas.
If plans do not go askew, Crampton and his staff will return home next September by way of the Isthmus of Panama.

LIFE BUOY AND OAR.

Very few persons know how to get into a life buoy, and, as in this uncertain world one never knows when one may need to make use of a buoy in real earnest, a little practice might prove of great value in an emergency.
Now, when the buoy is thrown into the water the temptation is to try to lift it over one's head and shoulders or to dive through it. This, however, is impossible. The correct thing is to grasp the two sides of the buoy with fingers of the hands uppermost, lower yourself under the center, and come up through the center, then rest your arms upon the sides, and you will be comfortably supported as long as it is necessary.
More often than otherwise, in case of accident, a life buoy is not at hand. In such an event an oar may be used as a substitute. Now, there is some little art in saving oneself by this means, for an average sized skull is not buoyant enough to support a person if grasped at the first impulse would direct.
There is only one way in which the oar will support a human being. It must be ridden like a hobbyhorse. The haft is put between the legs and the blade, allowed to project above the surface of the water in front of one. By this means the head is kept well above the water.—Pearson's Magazine.
