The presentation of the Grand Jury has again called attention to the unsightly and unsafe old jail building. It is discreditable to the City and Province alike. The suggestion of a new jail on a site outside the city, with land attached on which the prisoners could be compelled to earn their board seems a good one.

The severe weather has filled the straits with heavy ice much earlier this winter than in other years. This bids fair to give us two months or more to come in which the winter steamers may be put to the severest tests. Much will depend upon the direction and force of the winds. A prolonged northeast or east wind will almost inevitably block up Pictou harbor. Like Pharaoh's corn the Pictou route is always in danger of being blasted by the east wind.

The Montreal Star furnishes a list of candidates for the Commons so far nominated. The list includes 71 Conservatives, 60 Liberals and 4 Independents, a total 135. As there will be 214 members in the new House, and two candidates on an average may be expected to contest each seat, it will be seen that the parties are far from having completed their nominations. Prince Edward Island is up to date with the party nominations all made. British Columbia is the most backward of all, having made but two nominations as yet. Very probably the majority of the sitting members are in the field, whether with or without formal nominations by their party conventions.

We may yet have a revival of the tunnel scheme. A new idea in tunneling has developed at Detroit which if successful may have far reaching effects. It is proposed instead of tunneling beneath the river, to dredge a channel across the river bottom and place therein a steel tube, or rather two tubes one within the other the inner one having a diameter of nineteen feet and the outer one twenty-three feet. By this process the tunnel scheme is greatly cheapened, and it is not necessary to go so deep, which in turn lessens the grades. A company is being organized to test the principle at Detroit.

An Ontario despatch tells that there will be eight by-elections to be held and three vacancies in the Senate to be filled in the event of Parliament being held before a dissolution. As there are only seven vacancies in the Commons at present the eighth by-election may be supposed to be that for Westmorland to be caused by Mr. Emmerson entering the Cabinet. The eight by-elections, three of which will be in Quebec, two in Ontario, two in New Brunswick and one in P. E. Island, will no doubt afford some indication of how the Government stands in popular favor, but by no means the same as would be given by a general election.

Largely as the result of the appalling fire in Chicago scores of American and Canadian cities are taking action, inspecting theatres, music halls, hotels, schools, and public buildings and ordering improvements necessary to secure greater security for life in case of fire. As these investigations proceed most extraordinary but unsuspected dangers are disclosed. We shall deal with the matter more fully hereafter. At present we desire to remark upon the necessity for fire drill among the pupils in our public schools. This has been taken up in cities and towns all over the English-speaking world, and has proved effectual in saving thousands of lives. Moncton is moving in this matter, and the School Board have ordered improvements in existing exits, as well as increasing their number. Fire drill as frequently as once a month will be insisted upon, and at the opening of the term when new pupils are being admitted the drill will be required once a week for a month, and each principal will be required to make report monthly of the fire drills carried out.
