The forty-second Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of The Canadian Bank of Commerce was held in the banking house on Tuesday, 12th January, 1909, at 12 o'clock.

REPORT

The Directors have the pleasure of presenting to the Shareholders the forty-second Annual Report, covering the year ending 31st November, 1908, together with the usual Statement of Assets and Liabilities.

The balance at credit of Profit and Loss Account, brought forward from last year was \$ 675,912.10. The net profits for the year ending 31st November, after providing for all bad and doubtful debts, amounted to \$ 2,303,244.88.

ALBERTON, Jan. 16.—The annual meeting of the Alberton and West Prince Board of Trade took place in the Alberton Court House and a goodly number of its members were present and a fair share of business transacted.
