BY-LAWS

Allowing Discount City of Charlottetown

A By-law for allowing the rate of discount on the Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown, for general Civic purposes, for the current year ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1909.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown, as follows:—

1st. A Discount, at the rate of Two and One half per cent (2 1/2 pc) shall be allowed to all Taxpayers who shall, on or before the 20th day of July, A. D. 1909, pay the City Clerk, at his office, the Taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for Civic purposes.

SUPREME COURT

Yesterday morning in the Supreme Court in the case of Arbing vs Chisholm the court gave judgment declining the rule for a new trial.

In re application of Mary Jane McMillan for certiorari the court gave judgment confirming the conviction of the court below and discharging the rule with costs. Court then adjourned.

In the case of Sadie Buchanan vs the Provincial Grand Lodge a rule nisi for a non-suit or a new trial was granted to be argued at Michielmas term next.

In the case of James Arbing vs Jas Chisholm and another, action for trespass and assault tried in Summerside last June, when judgment was given for defendant, Mr McQuarrie moved for a new trial on the ground that the verdict was contrary to evidence. The Court took time to consider.

In the case of James McCallum vs International Harvester Co., tried in Summerside in June term last, Mr Johnston moved for a rule for a new trial on the ground, (1) that the verdict was contrary to evidence; (2) that the damages were excessive. The Court granted a rule nisi to be argued in Michielmas term next. In the case of Coulson vs John T. McKay, action in June term last when judgment was given for plaintiff, Mr Johnston moved for a non-suit. Court declines the rule.

Parquharson vs Weeks. By consent of counsel this case stands over till Michielmas term next.

In re application of Mary J. McMillan for certiorari. Attorney General Hazard shows cause against the rule Mr Johnson, K. C., in support.
