A. By using lemon juice and salt. Then hold over a steaming teakettle. The steam will aid greatly in removing the spots.

COOK'S CORNER

LEMON FLUFF

- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
 - 3 tablespoons flour
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup cold milk
 - 1 1/2 cups hot milk
 - 2 egg yolks
- Grated rind and juice of 2 large lemons
- 2 egg whites.
- Mix cornstarch, flour, sugar and salt and blend with the cold milk. Gradually stir in the hot milk and cook in double boiler, stirring constantly for about 15 minutes. Beat egg yolks, add grated lemon rind and a little of the mixture. Add to remaining mixture in double boiler and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes. Remove from heat and add lemon juice. Fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Turn into sherberts or a lightly greased mould. Chill before serving. Six servings.

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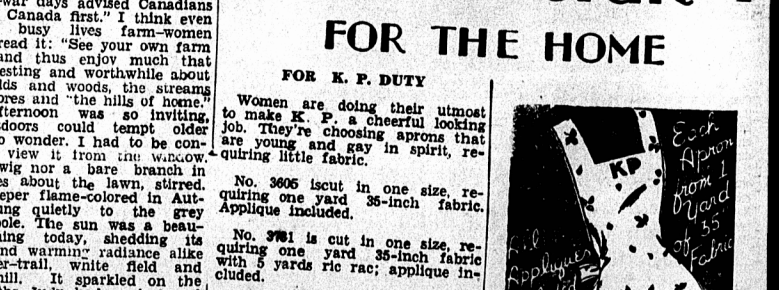
