JANUARY 6.

JESUS ANOINTED AT BETHANY. Matt. 26. 6-16. Memory verses, 11-13. "GOLDEN TEXT."

She hath done what she could.—Mark 14. 8.

Time.—Saturday evening, (probably April 1. A. C. 30.)
Place.—Bethany, a suburb east of Jerusalem

LESSON HELPS.

6. "Bethany," a small town on the eastern slope of the Mount of Olives, and now almost in ruins, was made ever famous by the presence of Jesus. "Simon the leper"—Nothing is known of him beyond this fact, but he was now probably cured or else there would have been no gathering at his house. Perhaps he was cured by Jesus; if so, the feast was prompted by gratitude.

7. "A woman having an alabaster box"—The woman was Mary, sister of Lazarus (John 12. 3). The box was in fact a small vase with a long neck which was broken, and from which the ointment poured forth. "Very precious"—That is very costly. "Poured it on his head"—An Eastern custom and a mark of respect.

8. "They had indignation"—Judas, the traitor, felt keenly and spoke promptly. He was narrow-minded and covetous. When one begins to censure others take it up. "This waste"—Judas figured that the ointment cost three hundred pence, which might have been given to the poor; but read John 12. 6 and see his character.

11. "Me ye have not always"—It was well to honour Christ during the brief life spent on earth.

13. "Be told for a memorial of her"—This verse is a prophecy which is rapidly being fulfilled. She is memorable for her act of affection. Her deed is linked with the memory and the work of the Savior.

14. "The chief priests"—Leaders of the Jewish people.

15. "What will ye give me?"—The question marks the greedy nature of Judas; he loved money more than he loved the Master. "Thirty pieces of silver"—A small reward; about fifteen dollars. That was about the price of a slave in those days.

16. "Sought opportunity"—Some time when the crowd would not be following Jesus.
