YOUNG FOLK TAKE TO SQUARE DANCE

TITHACA, N. Y., Dec. 2.—(CP)—They're swinging their partners these days with more "do-re-do" than in many a year. The old-fashioned square dance is not only on the way back, experts say, a conventional, but its revival has taken on the proportions of a craze. With the youngsters being the first to take the floor when the fiddle begins to sing, and the city folk flocking to barn dances so much that the dances are actually profitable, it appears that an old art form is being hauled out of mothballs and put to work.
