QUEBEC, July 23—Everything is ready for the departure of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Connaught, Princess Patricia and party tomorrow morning on board the government steamer Earl Grey en route for the maritime provinces. No social function was held during the present stay of the vice-regal family in Quebec. The governor-general received the visit of Hon. G. H. Perley, acting premier of Canada, who consulted with him on government business.
