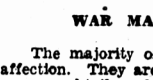

## Dorothy Dix Says— HEADACHES IN WAR MARRIAGES

### COOK'S CORNER

#### BACON MUFFINS

- 2 cups flour
  - 3 teaspoons baking powder
  - 1/3 cup sugar
  - 1/2 cup bacon, fried crisp
  - 2 tablespoons sugar
  - 1 egg beaten
  - 1 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup salt
- Method: Sift together the flour, baking powder and salt. Mix in the bacon which has been diced and fried crisp, and the sugar. Beat the egg and add to the milk, and stir into the first mixture. Then add the drippings. Fill greased muffin tins two-thirds full and bake in a hot oven (425 deg. F.) for about 20 minutes.

#### CRANBERRY MUFFINS

- 1/2 cup butter or shortening
  - 1/3 cup sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 2 cups flour
  - 4 teaspoons baking powder
  - 1/2 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup fresh cranberries
  - 3/4 cup raisins
- Method: Chop the cranberries and sprinkle with the 4 tablespoons sugar and let stand while preparing the batter. Cream the butter or shortening and then gradually cream in the butter cup sugar. Add the well-beaten eggs and mix well. Mix and salt the flour, baking powder and salt into the creamed mixture. Add the cranberries and mix well. Fill greased muffin pans two-thirds full with the batter. Bake in a moderately hot oven (400 deg. F.) for about 25 minutes.

#### COORN RING

- 2 1/2 cups milk
  - 2/3 cups fresh or canned corn
  - 3 tbsp. chopped green pepper
  - 2 cups soft bread crumbs
  - 3 cups, slightly beaten
  - 1/4 tsp. salt
  - 1/2 cup butter
- Heat milk with corn, green pepper and bread crumbs, but do not boil. Add to slightly beaten eggs, stirring constantly. Season and ring mold. Place in a pan of hot water and bake for 1 hour or until knife inserted into the mixture comes out clean. Loosen around edges with a knife and carefully invert on a round platter. Fill centre with desired mixture.
