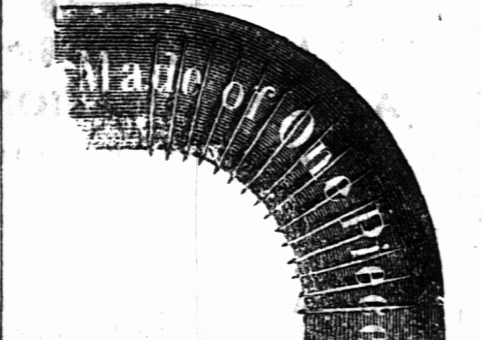

**COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL CHANGES IN CANADA.**

Upon his return from a trip to Canada, Mr. Griffiths, the Canadian Government Agent in Wales, was interviewed by a representative of The Western Mail and gave the reporter a graphic picture of the enthusiasm that prevailed in Canada over the sending of the contingents to South Africa. Mr. Griffiths also spoke of the great commercial and industrial changes which he found in Canada since the occasion of his former visit. "Take, for instance," said Mr. Griffiths, "the iron and coal at Cape Breton; where already some \$11,000,000 has been expended, and where it is claimed iron can be produced at about \$1 per ton cheaper than elsewhere which fact, it is stated, will give the Province of Nova Scotia the same eminence as a builder of steel ships that she once possessed in regard to wooden vessels. Then there is the pulp and paper industry. Canada possesses the largest and best supplies of raw material for the manufacture of paper in the world. Only a rash man would venture to place a limit to the extent of the development which will take place in this industry during the next few years. The same remarks apply to the mining in British Columbia and other parts of Canada. I observe that in a great number of instances these industries were controlled by Americans and developed by American capital. Although experiencing a wet harvest, with its attendant loss, Manitoba was still going ahead in a remarkable way. Real estate was booming. There was a general sense of security and satisfaction. Winnipeg was founded some 30 years ago—to day it has a population of 50,000, served with all the conveniences of civilization in the way of electric cars, light, etc." Toronto Globe.

**ENGLAND'S COMING CENSUS.**

An Enumeration to be Made on March 31st Next.

Under the direction of the local government board the register general and his able coadjutors at Somerset House are already preparing for the census of the United Kingdom on March 31st next. As it happens, the date falls on a Sunday, and that day has been chosen because most people are at home then. The people of Great Britain—England, Scotland and Wales—will be counted simultaneously with those of Ireland. In both cases the arrangements are on identical lines, except that Ireland will have a religious census, and the rest of the kingdom will not.

Preparatory to the census of ten years ago England and Wales were parceled out into 84,000 districts, so that allowing for the growth of the population, the number of districts next March will fall little short of 40,000. Each district will have an enumerator, his duty being to distribute, collect and copy the householders' schedules. Institutions and establishments holding more than 100 inmates will be especially enumerated, in the minority of cases by the chief resident officers. Appointed about the middle of February, this army of enumerators will be under the immediate control of the local registers, these in turn being supervised by superintendent registrars.

The enumerators will distribute the householders' schedules during the week prior to the census day and collect them on the Monday following. Within a reasonable period the returns must be delivered by the enumerators, so as to be examined and advised by the local registrars before being passed on to the superintendent registrars, who in due course transmit them to the census office. Summary returns form the basis of a preliminary report, which is succeeded by a general report, and both are in process of time laid before the houses of parliament.

When the results of their last census became known, the fact that the population of England and Wales fell short of the official estimates by nearly 730,000 created quite a sensation, but the random changes of inaccuracy were not substantiated. England and Wales were shown to contain 29,002,525 inhabitants, Scotland 4,025,647 and Ireland 4,704,750, making 37,732,922 the total for the United Kingdom. What increase is the forthcoming census likely to establish? According to the registrar general's estimate, the population of England and Wales in July of the present year amounted to 32,091,907, Scotland 4,313,963 and Ireland 4,515,471, representing an aggregate of 40,921,371 for the United Kingdom. Seeing that the natural increase of the population amounts roughly to 112,712 every three months the census of 1901 may be expected to demonstrate that Great Britain and Ireland contain no fewer than 41,259,507 people, or an advance of 3,528,584 since the census of 1891.
